Projects selected for State Fair

Please drop your projects off to the extension office between July 24-26th from 8am to 4:30 pm. If you have a very large, heavy, or fragile exhibit, we ask that you transport it yourself. You will be notified about this ahead of time. All projects (except food and garden) are due July 27th. **If you have a food item**, the vehicle will be leaving July 31st at 8:15 am. Canned, frozen, and preserved items can be dropped off the week prior but we recommend fresh products be dropped off morning of. Garden projects need to be taken down by families on Monday, July 31.

*Please read the rules for your specific project to ensure all necessary sheets and components are attached. For example, if you completed a sewing project, you will need to attach a skills card. Failure to do so will result in points being deducted. If you have questions please feel free to reach out to the office.

Grooming Assistance at the Indiana State Fair

Just a reminder that if you are planning to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair you need to make sure that you are in compliance with the Grooming Assistance rule. 4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother and siblings), from a current Indiana 4-H Member, and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification.
