Important Dates:

Please be aware of the important deadlines that are approaching! Remember that fair has been moved up to June this year, so deadlines are earlier. If you are showing an animal, besides rabbits or poultry, make sure they are all entered in 4-H online by May 15th. All projects, including static, need to be entered in Fair Entry by May 19th. Failure to do so could result in the inability to participate in that project for the 2023 fair. If you need help please call or email Jean or Rebecca.

News for Everyone

4-HOnline enrollment & payment of program fees is due by May 15, 2023.

If you enroll May 1-15, you must use a major credit card for payment.

Note: some animal projects have an earlier deadline.

Fair Entry is open. All entries are due May 19th

Failure to do so will result in those projects placing no higher than a blue ribbon (no honor, division reserve champion, division champion, State Fair Entry, reserve grand champion or grand champion).

Rules Book Available

There is a 2023 Rules Book which is available online at www.https://extension.purdue.edu/county/allen/allen-4h.html It is highly recommended each 4-H household print off a 2023 Rules Book.



We are asking for a 72 hour notice for pick up of manuals, poster sleeves, or materials. We do not have access to these storage rooms as freely as we use to. Thank you.

Add/Drop Deadline - May 15

Remember, you have until May 15, 2023 to add or drop projects on 4-HOnline. You **MUST** be enrolled in a project by May 15,2023. This will allow you to enter projects in Fair Entry. Call the Extension Office if you have any questions.

Fair Entry is Due May 19, 2023.

Think of Fair Entry as a RSVP for a class, pen, poster rack spot or a table spot for your project. We need to know how many spaces to reserve and what project labels we need to print. Fair Entry is to be completed by all in grades K-12. There will be a help session on May 17th from 5-8pm (open house style) for families who need help completing fair entry.

Tips and Tricks as questions have come in:

- You do not need to register an animal to a mini 4-H'er. Communicate with your committee/leaders your intent to show or participate
- Mini 4-H'ers do not specify projects on 4-H online. They will register for specific projects on Fair Entry
- If Fair Entry will not let you add an animal, check the animal tab under that child on 4-H online to ensure the animal is registered/listed.
- Sign up for everything you might bring to fair. It is easier to "scratch" project than add day of.



4-H FUN NIGHT



Premise ID

Do you need a Premise ID? If you are showing cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, or rabbits you will need a premise ID. If your animals are being housed on someone's property, they will hold the ID for their property.

To apply for an ID go to www.in.gov/boah/2700.htm. If you have not done this, please do it ASAP. It may take a few days to get the ID back and animal ID is due May 15th! If you are worried you will not get it by the May 15th deadline, I recommend you call the Board of Health at 317-544- 2381.

Grooming Assistance at the Indiana State Fair

Just a reminder that if you are planning to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair you need to make sure that you are in compliance with the Grooming Assistance rule. 4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother and siblings), from a current Indiana 4-H Member; and from

individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification. Please note that this program is only for Indiana residents.

*Those enrolled in this program should not see this as a way to do the work for the 4-H member, but should provide hands-on learning opportunities that further the skills and abilities of the 4-H member.



Transitioning from YQCA to the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

Please remember that every member exhibiting cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine has to complete either the online YQCA or in person QLC training. Failure to complete this requirement will result in the inability to show your animal at fair!

If you complete the National YQCA program, please email your certificate to Rebecca at rcclay@purdue.edu to ensure your requirement is marked complete in 4-H online. Also, note that all of the in person QLC trainings have past in Allen County. There are still a few surrounding counties that are offering the in person training. To register for another county's program, go to events under your child's profile on 4-H online. You then will click on the county you want to go to and that will allow you to see and register for a specific date. Please do not wait until the last minute!

Thank you to everyone who has already completed the training.

HORSE & PONY & LLAMA INFORMATION

Horse and Ilama identification must be entered in V2.4honline by May 15.

Please review the table on page 10 for the updated Animal ID requirements. All Horses and Ilamas, must be in V2.4honline on or before May 15. Fair Entry is due May 19th. Please remember to select all the classes you think you might compete in.

Identifying Animals in 4HOnline

Horses and Llamas are the only species requiring photographs in 2023. You will need to upload two images of your animals in V2.4honline for verification purposes. The first colored photo will be of the animal's head showing all features. The second colored photo will be a full body image showing all 4 feet and the head of the animal. If families need assistance adding the photos in 4HOnline, please call the office at 260-481-6429. Additional detailed instructions for identifying each species in 4HOnline are located on the home screen of 4HOnline after logging into your family profile.

Horse & Pony Activity Sheets: Due June 15 at the Horse & Pony Office at the Fairgrounds.

Llama manuals are due May 31 to the Allen County Extension Office

Horse & Pony Scholarship: 12th Graders - Check and ask your leader about the Joannie Tumbleson Horse & Pony Scholarship. The Application is due May 31. The form can be found on the Purdue Extension-Allen County Web Site.



Cattle, Horse, Llama, Swine, Sheep & Goat Animals identification must be entered in V2.4honline by May 15.

Please review the table on page 10 of the newsletter with updated Animal ID requirements. All Cattle, Horse, Llama, Swine, Sheep, and Goats must be in V2.4honline on or before May 15. If you intend to show at the state fair, all DNA Envelopes must be back to the office by 4:30 pm on Monday, May 15. This is a state fair deadline for DNA, so please do not miss this!

Ear Tags

Tag orders must have a 72 hour notice in order to be pulled. You can email jkendall@purdue.edu to request your tags. She will pull and let you know when you are good to pick up your tags. (No orders can be placed May 11 & 12 because Becca and Jean are out at Plant Sale Fundraiser). Not everyone in the office can pull tags so you must contact Jean.

Swine Members: Tags cost is \$5.00 each.

Beef Feeder Calves & Junior Heifers – Cost is \$7.00 for the set of tags.
