#### STATEWIDE SOIL HEALTH CENSUS

In the summer of 2024, ION collected soil health samples from across the state of Indiana to provide organic farmers with data on their soil health. This data has since been analyzed in Purdue laboratories and compiled into personalized soil health reports for each farmer. Our team is enthusiastic about how these reports will provide key insights into soil health across Indiana and help farmers improve the health of their soil. These reports will be released soon, so keep your eyes on our social media platforms for more updates.

#### **LEADERSHIP**

ION Advisory Board met back in February to discuss the future of ION. If you're not seeing as many beneficials as you'd like, maybe it's time to plan for some bug-friendly plantings around the farm.
