Participants will engage in four days of plenary sessions, breakout discussions, tours, and networking opportunities.



When to Hold Them or Fold Them (on Cash Rent)

This Purdue Center for Commercial Agriculture article uses the long-run cash rent spreadsheet to help farmers evaluate when to keep or drop a rented tract. By connecting crop budgets, yield trends, price forecasts, cost changes, and working-capital projections, the tool shows how a lease affects whole-farm finances over five years. The example shows that even a moderately sized tract can strain working capital if prices fall or costs rise.



The takeaway: cash-rent decisions should focus on long-term financial stability, not just next season.
