NUTRITION EDUCATION PROGRAM

Looking for a new recipe to for the end of summer zuchhini? Below is the perfect recipe for a side dish:

Baked Zucchini Sticks:

4 medium zucchini, 2 eggs, 1/8 cup milk, ¼ cup finely grated parmesan cheese, 1 ½ cup bread crumbs, 1 Tablespoon dry Italian herbs

Directions: 1. Cut zucchini into long sticks, about 3 inches long. 2. Microwave zucchini for about 3 minutes. Pat zucchini sticks dry with a paper towel. 3. Mix eggs and milk together in a small bowl. Mix cheese, bread crumbs and herbs together in another small bowl.4. Dip zucchini sticks first into the egg mixture and then into the bread crumb mixture. 5. Arrange zucchini in rows on a metal baking sheet that has been sprayed with cooking spray. Broil zucchini sticks for about 12 to 15 minutes, turning once while cooking.

The Cass County Community Garden

Earlier this year I worked with the Cass County Community Garden group to apply for a Growing Together grant through the Purdue Extension Nutrition Education Program . We received notification in late winter that we were awarded the maximum amount of \$1500 to expand and enhance the community garden this summer. The Cass County Community Gardeners are in their 2nd year of gardening in raised beds behind Empower Juice + Yoga. The group worked together to map out and plan their garden. Some of the plants they collectively decided to grow were lettuces, tomatoes, tomatillos and peppers. They are always welcoming new community members who are interested in gardening together. No experience is necessary to join. The group meets every Wednesday at 5:00 behind Empower to plant, weed and harvest produce that is then donated to Emmaus Mission Center Food Pantry. COUNTY FAIR IN REVIEW

The 2024 Cass County Fair continued the tradition of excellence for Cass County 4-H. Cass County saw over 25,000 attendees, even with poor weather on Wednesday night and Thursday morning! We had over 1000 head of livestock exhibited at the Fair this year, plus nearly 800 entries for State & County static projects, also known as Community Center projects. With nearly 500 4-hers, including our 100 Mini 4-Hers, this is small uptick in 4-H participation compared to 2022/2023

Highlights of fair week include the Premier Showmanship contest, won by 10 year 4-Her Kinsey Mennen, the Royal Showmanship Contest won by 10 Year 4-Her Kaylyn Zeigler, and the 4-H Parade of Champions where all of our static projects Champions and Judges Award winners were recognized. Plus, the Cass County Junior Leaders hosted the Stock the Trailer event, which collected over 1000lbs of food donated to the Emmaus Mission Center in Logansport, as well as a Red Cross Blood Drive, which collected over 35 pints of blood and earned \$350 for our Junior Leaders!

Fun Fact: for the first time in recorded Cass County fairs, all of the Barn Chairmen were women! Cass County is a great place for women in Ag!
