## Things You Need to Know

- If you are showing livestock (does not include rabbit, & equine and camelids may voluntarily register) at the state or county fair, you must have a premise ID from the Indiana Board of Animal Health. In the event you moved, you must reapply for a premise ID as it is tied to the address where animals are housed. If you are housing your animals at someone else's address, you must use that premise ID on 4-H Online. For information on how to register, or recover a lost premise ID and more, please visit this site: <a href="https://bit.ly/4imnOui">https://bit.ly/4imnOui</a> [control click on https] Storing Premise ID tip: enter the Premise ID and number in your phones contacts for easy access.
- All animal project members [except alpaca, dog, cat, horse and pony & pocket pets] must complete the Quality Livestock Care training this year in order to exhibit at the local and state fair. Training dates have changed: January 11th, 12-1, Agner Hall, February 9th, 2-3 pm Agner Hall; &. February 19, 5:30-6:30 pm, Fair Office Fairgrounds; YQCA certificates will still be accepted for online only completion. If you have a conflict with all these dates please contact Liz for options. You must register for the event in 4-H Online and you MUST be an approved 4-H member in 4-H Online in order to access event registration. Cost will be \$3 per participant. If you have questions, contact liz.
- ◆ Visit the 4-H webpage to review state project guidelines. <a href="https://bit.ly/4iFEoFQ">https://bit.ly/4iFEoFQ</a> [control click on https, select offered project link]. There are a few minor changes to a handful of projects so please review your project guidelines.
- ◆ The Tractor, Lawn and Garden and Zero Turn <u>operator skills contests</u> will no longer require a written test; only parts ID and obstacle course completion.
- ♦ 2025 4-H Handbook coming soon. Will be available as download and also a few hardcopies.

Beef tagging is February 8th, 1-3 pm, Fairgrounds, and Spring ID [dairy, sheep, goats and swine alternative] is April 25, 6-8 pm Fairgrounds.




# 4-H is calling all doers!
