**May 15th** is the deadline for 4-H livestock project animals, except poultry, to be registered in 4-H Online and Members, as well as, Cloverbuds & Volunteers to submit their T-shirt size in 4-H Online event. You must have submitted a shirt size by May 15th in order to get a shirt during the Fair. Parents who wish to purchase a T-shirt, may call the Extension Office at 812-926-1189 to submit shirt sizes by May 15th.

Are you interested in the Sun's power? Sunny Side Up: 4-H Fun with Solar Power will be held April 15, 4-6 pm, at the Extension Office meeting room. The program is free, however, youth must register at <u>https://</u> <u>SunnySideUpSolarPower.4honline.com</u> by April 7th. Open to youth grades 3-12, 4-H members or participants. Free T-shirt for all who register by April 7th.

## CLOVER CORNER-PPER PLATE ANIMALS

Use paper plates and construction paper to make a rooster or sheep. You can use your imagination to make other animals, too.

**For the rooster**, fold your plate in half. Cut out a comb and wattle from red construction paper (or color white paper with a red crayon) and a beak from yellow paper (or color white paper yellow). Glue on a googly eye or just use a black marker or crayon to make an eye. Have youth google why roosters have wattles?





**To make a sheep:** Fleece is made out of cotton balls you glue onto the plate. Cut out a face and ears with black construction paper or color white paper. Finally cut out eyes to glue on the face. Have youth google why do sheep have fleece?

- April 30-Purdue Day of Giving-Donated funds can benefit Dearborn County 4-H and all contributions are welcome large and small!

- May 15th is a big deadline in 4-H! You must be enrolled in 4-H Online by May 15, if you want to participate in the Fair this summer. If you are already enrolled, you can add or drop projects until May 15, 2025.
- May 15 is the deadline for all livestock, including alpaca and horse and pony, to be enrolled into 4-H online. Pen Entry forms are due as well.
- May 15 is the deadline to submit T-shirts size in 4-H Online event for members, Cloverbuds and Volunteers. Parent wanting to purchase a shirt must call the Ext. Office 812-926-1189 with their size by May 15th. No shirts will be available for those who did not submit a shirt size.
- Jr. Livestock Committee will meet on May 21, 6-7 pm. In the Fair Office on the fairgrounds. All livestock project members grades 7-12 are invited to attend.



## Things You Need to Know

- If you want to attend 4-H Camp but need some financial support, <u>please</u> <u>contact liz at ebeiers@purdue.edu by April 7th!!</u> We have limited funds available to help.
- If you are showing livestock (does\_not include rabbit, & equine and camelids may voluntarily register) at the state or county fair, you must have a premise ID from the Indiana Board of Animal Health. In the event you moved, you must reapply for a premise ID as it is tied to the address where animals are housed. If you are housing your animals at someone else's address, you must use that premise ID on 4-H Online. - Summer brings several State 4-H opportunities: Registration for 4-H Academy and 4-H Round-Up opened March 15. To register, let the Extension Office know of your interest, and they will begin the registration for you. You must complete the registration. - June 23-25-4-H Round-Up is an exciting opportunity offered to youth who have completed grades 7, 8, and 9. Attendees have an opportunity to explore a variety of careers by attending classes created just for Round-Up attendees at Purdue University. Participants will get a taste of college life and will live in a Purdue Residence Hall for two nights. Youth have an opportunity to meet others from across the state and further develop their leadership skills. Recreation events are planned in the evenings to allow attendees the opportunity to build friendships on their own.
- June 11-13-4-H Academy @ Purdue is a program held at Purdue University specifically designed to offer hands-on, exciting opportunities to learn about a diverse selection of subjects and careers. During this conference previously known as 4-H Science Workshops, participants will meet and learn from professors, graduate students and other experts in their respective fields and participate in interactive activities and experiential learning. Participants stay in a Purdue University Residence Hall for two nights while exploring the Purdue University campus and meeting 4-H members from across Indiana. 4-H Academy @ Purdue is open to all youth grades 9-12.
- ◆ 4-H Exhibit Hall Worker at Indiana State Fair: Youth are afforded an opportunity to work at the Indiana State Fair as an Exhibit Hall Worker. Duties include checking-in non-animal 4-H exhibits, preparing exhibits for display to the public, record keeping, interacting with fair attendees, assisting with a variety of state fair events, and releasing exhibits. Workers will develop team work, customer service, record keeping, and other work related skills through this temporary employment opportunity. Exhibit Hall Workers must be a minimum of 14 years of age. This employment opportunity is also available to college-age young adults. Exhibit Hall Worker are expected to reside on-site in the reserved dormitory space. This is a minimum wage earning employment opportunity. <u>https://bit.ly/Exhibithallworker</u>
