



Junior Leaders

Description:

The Junior Leader project allows 4-H members in grades 7-12 the opportunity to provide their Adult 4-H Volunteers with additional assistance in their 4-H Clubs and related activities while serving as mentors and role models to the younger 4-H members by sharing their experiences with them. Many counties offer county-wide opportunities for Jr. Leaders to meet and serve the community.

Decatur County Expectations

Serve the community by leading and participating in community service activities. Develop leadership and communication skills. Make connections with 4-H members from across the county and state. Act as a leader and role model in 4-H Clubs as well as outside of the 4-H program including in school, extracurriculars, and the community.

Exhibit Guidelines

Junior leaders develop skills in the areas of civic engagement, leadership, entrepreneurship and more through a variety of hands-on experiences throughout the year.

Exhibit Class Guidelines:

- Attend a minimum of 50% of the Junior Leader meetings. Most meetings are held on the fourth Monday of each month at 7:00 pm.
- Complete a minimum of 3 service projects throughout the year.
- Work during the building judging for the fair.
- Work at least one shift at a booth, event, or fundraiser hosted by Junior Leaders during the fair.
