All 4-H youth enrolled in a LIVESTOCK PROJECT (Beef, Dairy Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine) must be QLC certified or have a YQCA online completion certificate.

If you choose to complete the YQCA option, you will register for the online course at https://yqcaprogram.org/ Cost of the online YQCA course is \$12.

After completing the course, you must email the 4-H Educator with your certificate to receive credit.

If you prefer to take the QLC in person (Instructor-Led), the cost is \$3 per child and will be located at the Exhibit Hall (Fairgrounds); Registration is open now in 4-H Online!



September 8 Deadline Breakdown

If you are planning to exhibit Beef Feeders at Fall Fair:

1.Make entries into 4-H Online by September 2 for those animals using the "DeKalb Co ONLY: Beef Feeder Calves" animal types. Link: https://v2.4honline.com/

2.Go to FairEntry and make class selections in the system. Link: http://dekalbcountyindiana.fairentry.com/ (Log on with 4-H Online information)

If you are planning to exhibit livestock at the Fall Fair:

1.Go to FairEntry and make class selections in the system. This can be done as soon as you know what you will be exhibiting. Changes can be made to entries at checkin using the animals you have nominated in 4-H Online. However, please make your best guess on what you are bringing, so fewer changes need to be made later. Any animal nominated in 4-H Online can be brought to the fair as long as it meets qualifications. Link: http://dekalbcountyindiana.fairentry.com/ (Log on with 4-H Online information)

Pre-Fair Clean-up/Set-up Sunday, Sept. 14 • 1-4 pm

- Pick up any trash, leaves, etc.
- Clean up barns and wash rack
- Set up the Exhibit Hall for projects
- Clean picnic tables, benches, etc.

During The Fair...

- Throw your trash in barrels provided.
- Pick up trash on grounds or in buildings.
- Work a shift at the north and/or south Food Stands.
- When showing an animal: Keep your pens clean and your animal fed and watered—Help pick up trash in show ring— Ask your livestock superintendent what you can do to help throughout the week—Do your final pen clean-up on Sunday.

Post-Fair Clean-up Sunday, September 28 • 9 am




Go to https://dekalbcountyindiana.fairentry.com and sign in using your 4HOnline email and password

Choose if you would like to register an individual or click that green box. Review your Exhibitors information and make changes where need be.



SECTION 2 - ENTRIES TAB

- 1. Click the green "Add an Entry" box to the right of the exhibitor's name
- 2. Click the green "Select" box next to the Department you would like to enter
- 3. To register an animal entry from 4HOnline, you will select the white "add an animal" box during the entry process.




4. A smaller box with two options will pop up. Choose the green "Choose an Existing Animal Record" box to enter an animal that was identified in 4HOnline.

To enter Poultry/ Pigeons/Waterfowl animal, please select "Enter a New Animal Record", and complete all applicable fields on the screen.



 Select the circle next to the animal you would like to enter. Then select the green "Select Animal" box.



6. All of the information about that animal will be pulled over from 4-H Online, so that you can check to make sure that is the correct animal. If you want to switch to a different animal, click on the "remove from entry box". If it is correct, click the green "Continue" box. Then you will be taken to the Additional Questions page. Make sure to answer all the questions.



SECTION 3 - PAYMENT TAB

***The payment section is a formality of the system. No payment is needed, but you must go through the steps to submit your entries. It is best to enter all entries for all exhibitors in your family before completing the Payment and submission steps.

- Review your invoice, either in summary format or detail format. If it looks correct, click the green "Continue" box. If not, go back to the entries tab and fix what you need to.
- Select the green "Continue box.

**There are no fees for 4-H exhibits.



 Confirm your entries one last time. You can see a summary of exhibitors in your family, or their entries in detail. Make sure all entries for each exhibitor in your family are listed before you submit the entries.


NOTE: Once you hit submit, you cannot edit your entries.

Click Continue to confirm and submit your entries.

11. Click the Submit button to submit your entries.

 You will receive a "Thanks!" message. You can choose the button to "Visit Dashboard" to see your entry.

You will receive an email from FairEntry after your entry has been submitted. You will also receive an email from FairEntry letting you know if your entry was approved or rejected, a reason will be listed and you will be able to log in and fix the problem before submitting that entry again. Supreme Showman Contest Rules

4-H Council is proud to present the Supreme Showmanship contest Sponsored by Beacon Credit Union.

The goal of the Supreme Showmanship contest is to expand and enhance all livestock showmanship skills, to increase appreciation for all livestock species with knowledge and to develop a dynamic spirit among 4-H members.

Guidelines:

- 1. Premier Showmanship winners from Beef, Dairy, Dairy Feeders and Steers, Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Rabbit, and Poultry are eligible to compete.
- 2. A 4-H member may earn the right to participate by winning a premier showman of a specific species. He/She may win Supreme Showmen an unlimited number of times.
- 3. In case one person wins more than one Premier showman specie, that person will represent the first specie won and the second specie's Premier runner up will represent the second specie. Each premier winner has the right not to participate if they so choose, it will then also go to the runner-up. If the runner-up decides not to participate, at the discretion on the committee a 3rd place contestant could be used or that species will not have a showman in that years Showmanship contest.
- 4. Nine (9) classes will be set up using animals which have been shown at the Fair. There will be one (1) class each of Beef, Dairy, Dairy Feeders and Steers, Meat Goat, Diary Goat, Sheep, Swine, Rabbit, and Poultry.
- 5. Participants will all show the same species at the same time, with order of species being decided by committee.
- 6. Barn superintendents will select the nine (9) animals of each species to be used in the contest. The show host will provide the necessary equipment needed for the specie for all contestants (9 show sticks, brushes, etc.)
- 7. Contestants will draw numbers to determine the animal used for each species as the species enters the ring. Contestants may not draw their own animal, if it is used in the contest.
- 8. There will be a 15 min per species time limit for all species in the show

- 9. This is strictly a showman ship contest. Due to this, no grooming shall be considered in the judging. All contestant animals are to be clean, brushed and combed, no elaborate grooming shall be permitted.
- 10. Each species will be shown under the appropriate guidelines of that species, and to the preference of the judge.
- 11. The contestants will score 100% on showmanship and knowledge exhibited to the judge. There will be 2 judges (1 for small animals and 1 for large animals)
- 12. An award will be presented to the first-place individual. Other awards for contestants may be presented.
- 13. In the event of a tie the judges will present a question to contestants.
- 14. The Supreme Showman contest will be held on Friday of the Fair in the Show Arena at the published time.
