



Enrollment Tips



4-H Online is the online system that we use for enrollment, signing up for events, animal ID, etc.

- DO NOT create a new account if you were previously a 4-H member or even if you skipped a year. Unsure of the email used to create the account, please call Purdue Extension-Dubois County office at 812-482-1782.
- DO NOT create a new member profile if you don't see your youth on the member list.
 They might not have been active and we "archived" them. Please call Purdue
 Extension Dubois County office at 812-482-1782 to unarchive them.
- You DO NOT have full access unless you are "active 4-H member". Active meaning, enrolled, submitted and paid \$15 state program fee
- If you want multiple people to get information, please add 4-H member's email in the member profile and then one parent as the family member profile. If you want the second parent to receive the information, please add their email in another member's profile or if the current member is too young for email, put in the one.
- Fastest and easiest way to become active is to pay be credit card when you enroll online.
- Unsure of what 4-H club to select. You may select Contact me about 4-H club or select one based on location and then learn about when they meet. If the club doesn't work out no worries, we can always change that information. For full list of clubs and contact information: https://extension.purdue.edu/county/dubois/club-info.html
- Interested in a project-based club. To receive communications from the club, pick the club that goes with the project.
- Unsure of what projects to select. You are selecting "Project area" in 4-H Online. Use

Premise ID Information -

Premise ID is required for any 4-H livestock animal (beef, dairy, goat, rabbit, sheep, and swine) that will be exhibited and entered in the food system. It provides the information needed to trace the animal from processing back to the farm to ensure a safe food system and necessary biosecurity.

If there were animals on the property beforehand, then you will need to check if there is a premise id already assigned. To check to see if there is an existing Premise ID email animalideboah.in.gov (Include your name and physical address in the email.)

To obtain a new Premise ID please go here https://www.in.gov/boah/traceability-and-premise-id/indiana-premises-registration/ and you can complete an online form. It will ask you questions about what animals will be on the property but there is a spot that you can select 4-H as the reason animals will be located on the property.

Quality Livestock Care Trainings



To exhibit BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, POULTRY, and RABBITS, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H.




