

### Mini 4-H Projects



#### **Arts & Crafts**

In this project you will experiment with different colors and textures to create an art project of your choice. For your exhibit you will mount your art work on a poster.



#### Beef

Complete a poster project and be paired with an animal by Beef Club leaders. Participate in a non-competitive show with the animal's owner.



#### **Bicycle**

This project will teach you how to care for your bicycle and ride it safely. For your exhibit you will make a poster about what you have learned.



#### **Collections**

Do you save rocks, buttons, butterflies or anything else? This project helps you organize your things.



#### **Cake Decorating**

This project will teach you the basics of cake decorating to prepare you for a future cake decorating project in 4-H.



#### **Dinosaurs**

In this project you will learn about dinosaurs and how they lived long ago.



#### Pets

This project teaches how to have fun and care for your pet.



#### Sewing

In this project you will begin to collect the tools you will need to start sewing.



#### **Tractor**

In this project you will learn about tractors, how they are used, and safety precautions.





#### **Farm Animals**

In this project you will learn about farm animals. You may choose from dairy cows, beef cattle, goats, sheep, rabbits, poultry, horses and swine.



#### **Foods**

In this project you will learn about the food groups and My Plate guidelines. As you learn to mix and measure ingredients, you will have fun making cookies.



#### Flowers & Garden

You will learn how to plant and care for your flowers & garden.



#### Models

This project helps you learn to follow directions. You will complete a snap together model.



#### Bugs

In this project you will explore some of the things that make bugs different from each other.



#### **Forestry**

In this project you will study types of seeds and leaves of trees. You will also learn how animals make their homes in trees, what trees give us and how trees help us.



#### Wildlife

This project helps you learn what animals need to survive.



#### **Photography**

The Mini 4-H Photography project, currently in development, will introduce children in grades K-2 to the basics of photography, including how to capture everyday moments using simple cameras or smartphones. Participants will use their photos to create a Mini 4-H poster for the fair, exploring creative photo composition while learning to express their perspectives.

## Where do I find supplies?

In an effort to assist you, below is a list of resources for supplies. This list is not all inclusive. No endorsement by 4-H of products or services is implied or intended.

11" x 14" foam poster boards and clear plastic sleeves that fit the Mini 4-H posters are available for purchase at the Purdue Extension Elkhart County office. Please note we only accept cash or check. Office hours are 8:00-4:30pm, Monday-Friday.

Cake Decorating Forms are available for a fee in the Extension Office. Dioramas should be in a standard size shoebox (no oversize boxes, please) and covered with roll vinyl.

Models should be mounted on a base no larger than one inch larger than the model, in all directions. This can be a piece of cardboard with toothpicks on each side of the tires, to keep the model from rolling off the base or a decorative base of your choosing. Legos are acceptable!
