

The objective of the RC Club is to give kids a place to explore the hobby of remote control cars. The kids will learn to drive their car, design track, and basic maintenance of their RC vehicle. Kids bring their own cars or can use RC club cars.

The requirements for completion is RC Club are as follows:

- Participate in the RC Club Rally in May
And/or
- Make a project or poster to be displayed at the fair.

Posters are displayed horizontally 22" x 28" and mounted on a firm backing and covered in clear plastic or other transparent material. Please choose one of the options below for posters/projects:

Level A grades 3-5:

- Poster about your RC vehicle including pictures of your vehicle in action and a description of your vehicle
- Poster explaining safety pertaining to the usage of your vehicle
- Diagram of your vehicle and the remote control

Level B grades 6-8:

- Poster diagram of your vehicle and the remote control
- Poster of a track you design
- Poster explaining the safety pertaining to the usage of your vehicle
- Poster showing your knowledge of battery care and maintenance

Level C grades 9-12

- Video of your remote control car in action on your designed track
- 3D model of a track design no larger than 22" x 28" base and 12" in height
- Maintenance video or poster regarding a remote control car and the controller
- Construct a remote control car
