



Come May 15, from 5-7 PM to the Extension office for help registering projects in Fair Entry before the May 15 deadline at midnight. Livestock 4-H'ers -Bring Premise ID & all Animal ID info with you.



Quality Livestock In-person Training for 3-12th Graders 4-H'ers showing animals in the fair need to take either the online YQCA or in-person training. The final two in person dates at the Floyd County Extension Office are:

April 5, 10 AM Must register at 4-H Online under Events by April 3

Be sure to **sign in at the door so your training will be recorded by our office. A Certificate of Completion will be awarded at the end of training.

 YQCA (Youth Quality Care of Animals) is for those showing animals all year round. This is only offered online at the YQCA website. Once taken, it is the 4-H'ers
 responsibility to email a completed certificate to <u>denglema@purdue.edu</u> or bring a printed certificate to the Floyd County Extension office by May 15 so we can record training in your 4-H profile. State requirement -No exceptions.

Why Should You Care About Invasive Species?

- Causes Harm to Wildlife Costly to Control Changes Soil Chemistry
 - Causes Erosion
 - Hinders Recreation
 - Nuisance in Gardens



Soil Testing

Soil testing can help you decide how to amend your garden or lawn depending on what you're planting by looking at the calcium, phosphorous, potassium, and pH levels!

To collect soil for a soil test:

- Remove surface debris, such as mulch, and dig down 4-6 inches
- Break up any large lumps and ensure there are no rocks, sticks, or other debris in your soil sample
- Place at least one cup of soil ready for the test in a plastic bag or cup and bring to our office!

Soil tests are \$20 per sample. Cash or check ONLY!

Make check payable to Purdue CES Ed Fund You will receive your soil test results in the mail approximately 2-4 weeks after drop-off.
