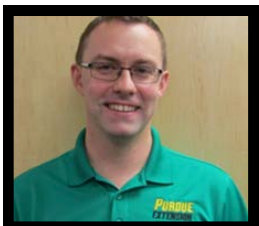

Bring on the Crunch!

October is National Apple Month!



Apples are one of the most popular fruits in the United States! They are easy to store. They come in different varieties for different levels of sweetness. They can be incorporated into a sweet or savory dish or they can even be a crunchy snack all on their own! Apples are not only delicious but nutritious! They provide vitamin C, potassium, and fiber (especially in the peel).

Some Popular Varieties of Apples

**Braeburn**

Sweet-tart flavor and crisp texture. Good fresh or cooked.

**Honeycrisp**

Crisp, sweet and juicy. Excellent fresh or cooked. Can be frozen.

**Pink Lady (Cripps Pink)**

Sweet-tart flavor and firm, crisp texture. Excellent fresh or cooked. Very good for freezing.

**Fuji**

Crunchy and super sweet. Good fresh, cooked or frozen.

**Granny Smith**

Crunchy and tart. Good fresh, cooked or frozen.

**Golden Delicious**

Crisp, sweet and mellow with a tender skin. Stays white longer after cutting. Excellent for all purposes.

**Gala**

Crisp and very sweet. Good fresh or cooked but not recommended for freezing.

**Red Delicious**

Crunchy texture and mildly sweet flavor. Deep red skin adds color. Best used fresh.

Sweet Tips for Apples:

- Be sure to wash your apples!
- Whole apples can be stored at room temperature for a few days. In the crisper drawer of a fridge, they can last up to 6 weeks.
- To reduce waste, apples that have slightly shriveled are great for baking or sauces!
- Apples tend to brown after they are peeled or cut, but it is not harmful. To keep cut apples looking fresh for a few hours, dip the cut pieces in lemon or orange juice and refrigerate in a covered container.
- Refrigerating cut apples in a container of water also keeps them white, crisp, and ready to eat.

How to Freeze Apples:

1. Slice apples.
2. Dip slices in lemon or orange juice to prevent browning.
3. Spread in a single layer on a baking sheet and freeze for 1 to 2 hours.
4. Transfer frozen slices to an airtight freezer container.
5. Use within 8 months for best quality.

Apple Spice Baked Oatmeal

Ingredients:

- 1 **egg**, beaten
- ½ cup **applesauce**
- 1 ½ cups **nonfat** or **1% milk**
- 1 teaspoon **vanilla**
- 2 Tablespoons **vegetable oil**
- 1 **apple**, chopped (about 1 ½ cups)
- 2 cups **old fashioned rolled oats**
- 1 teaspoon **baking powder**
- ¼ teaspoon **salt**
- 1 teaspoon **cinnamon**

TOPPING

- 2 Tablespoons packed **brown sugar**
- 2 Tablespoons **chopped nuts** (optional)



Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 375 °F. Lightly oil an 8x8-inch baking dish.
2. Combine the egg, applesauce, milk, vanilla and oil in a bowl. Mix in the apple.
3. In a separate bowl, mix the rolled oats, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Add to the liquid ingredients and mix well.
4. Pour mixture into baking dish, and bake for 25 minutes.
5. Remove from oven and sprinkle with brown sugar and (optional) nuts.
6. Return to oven and broil for 3 to 4 minutes until top is browned and the sugar bubbles.
7. Serve warm. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.

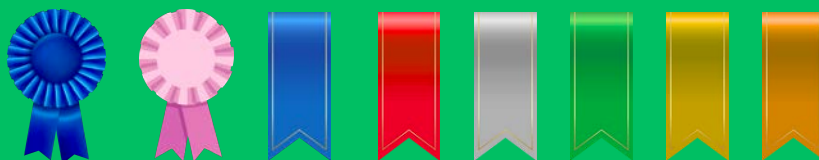
4-H eSports

Entries must meet division guidelines so that they will not be lowered a ribbon placing. Blue, Red, and White placing ribbons will be issued to all exhibits properly entered on time. Ribbon placing is determined by project completion based on the project guidelines.

Green- Participation only, late or project not registered in Fair Entry by May 15

White- Poorly constructed or barely meets guidelines

Red- Adequate or does not fully meet guidelines

Blue- Very complete, meets guidelines, well-constructed

Yellow- Floyd County Jr. Leaders awards yellow ribbons as honorable mentions.

Orange- Indiana State Fair awards orange ribbons for exceptional projects, blue for merit and sweepstakes to best overall.

Blue Circle Sticker- project was selected as an Indiana State Fair exhibit

Soil Testing

Soil testing can help you decide how to amend your garden or lawn depending on what you're planting by looking at the calcium, phosphorous, potassium, and pH levels!



To collect soil for a soil test:

- Remove surface debris, such as mulch, and dig down 4-6 inches
- Break up any large lumps and ensure there are no rocks, sticks, or other debris in your soil sample
- Place at least one cup of soil ready for the test in a plastic bag or cup and bring to our office!

Soil tests are \$20 per sample. Cash or check ONLY!

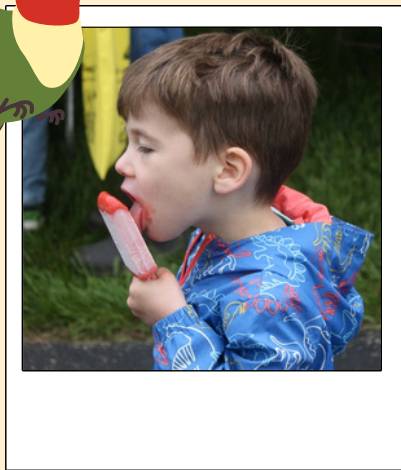
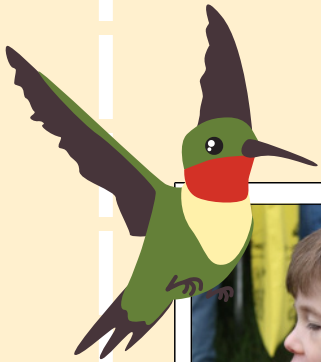
