#### Purdue Extension/4-H Relationship

Purdue University is Indiana's land grant institution and delivers 4-H through the Cooperative Extension Service. The Cooperative Extension Service is supported through the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) and "provides non-formal education and learning activities to people throughout the country- to farmers and other residents of rural communities as well as to people living in urban areas. It emphasizes taking knowledge gained through research and education and bringing it directly to the people to create positive changes" (nifa.usda.gov). 4-H is offered across the nation but may look a little different from state-to-state. I encourage you to participate in state and national 4-H opportunities, as these connections you make will last a lifetime.





#### **4-H Volunteers**

Our program has over 500 youth members, which is very exciting for our community! We also have over 100 adult volunteers who work hard and dedicate their time to ensure that our program is successful. #### Communication

The majority of our information that we send out will be communicated through email. Most emails will come from myself, Sara, Gwen, or 4HOnline-Purdue Extension/Indiana 4-H. If you are not receiving emails, let me know as soon as possible. If you are not able to access email, let me know so we can be sure to send information to you in a different way (i.e., USPS).

#### 4-H Online

You are receiving this because you signed up for 4-H in 4-H Online. However, please be sure that your status has been "approved." You are not an approved 4-H member until your enrollment fee is paid. Volunteers are not approved until they complete enrollment and youth protection trainings. We will utilize 4-H Online as our information database. Make sure to keep your profile updated- if you have an address, phone number, or email change, update it in the system, both under your individual profile AND your family profile. Contact the office if you need help with this.

#### **Fair Entry**

Fair Entry is a system that organizes all exhibits for the fair. Results and placings will be kept track of using this system, so it is important for all 4-Hers to enter their exhibit information before the deadline. This includes both animal and static project exhibits. For animal exhibits, 4-Hers must enter each class they plan to exhibit in at the fair. Failure to enter exhibits on Fair Entry could result in failure to participate at the fair. Any 4-H exhibitor arriving at the fair to check-in an animal or non-animal exhibit and has not completed the Fair Entry process will not be permitted to advance through the fair's check-in process until entry has been completed in Fair Entry. 4-H educators have the discretion to change or update entries at the request of the 4-Her's family. Be on the lookout for Fair Entry directions in late May/early June. Right now, you can mark your calendar that Fair Entry will be open beginning on June 9<sup>th</sup>. Static projects and mini 4-H projects must be entered by June 20<sup>th</sup>. Animal entries must be completed by July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### 2025 Franklin County 4-H Fair

Franklin County 4-H Fair events begin for 4-Hers on Wednesday, July 9<sup>th</sup>. There is a schedule included for you convenience. It is also available in the handbook.

#### Franklin County 4-H Handbook

The handbook is a great resource for all 4-H members, volunteers, and families. It is a rather long document but you can utilize the table of contents to find what is applicable to you. All of the changes are in red font and the new book is updated on our website at <a href="https://extension.purdue.edu/county/franklin/franklin-4h.html">https://extension.purdue.edu/county/franklin/franklin-4h.html</a>. Let the office know if you have any questions or if you would like to request a printed copy. As a reminder, it is YOUR responsibility to understand any rule changes, dates, etc. If you are unsure of something, please ask. The handbook is subject to change and any changes will be communicated accordingly.

#### **Green Folders**

Each 4-H member will receive a Green Folder with a Franklin County Points Sheet, My Record of Achievement, Project Record Sheet, and record sheets/skill sheets and project manuals (if applicable). Mini 4-H members don't necessarily have a Green Folder, but they do have a packet with their project manuals and other important information. The Green Folders/Mini 4-H Packets are ready for pick up at the Extension Office now until March 1. After March 1, your 4-H club leader will have them to give out at 4-H meetings.

#### **Project Manuals**

Several 4-H projects have manuals that may be used for additional information or guidance in completing the project. These manuals are available at Shop4-H.org or can be requested from the Extension Office until our inventory runs out. If the

manual is required for project completion, it will be provided at no cost with your Green Folder. These projects include Achievement, Child Development, Consumer Clothing, and Electric. All animal project exhibitors will receive a resource book that they will keep for their entire 4-H career (1 per family). Mini 4-H members will receive manuals for static projects.

#### **Extended Office Hours**

We will have extended office hours on the following days from 4:00 pm until 6:00 pm: February 24<sup>th</sup>, February 27<sup>th</sup>, June 18<sup>th</sup>, July 1<sup>st</sup>. Please utilize this time to pick up Green Folders/Mini 4-H Packets, enter animal ID data, complete Fair Entry, ask questions, etc. If there is ever a time you are not able to make it to our office during normal business hours, please let me know. I would be happy to work something out.

#### **Mini 4-H Information**

Mini 4-H is a fun way to get youth involved in the program before "regular" 4-H begins. Mini 4-H is exhibition only, meaning youth do not actually compete for awards. Youth signed up for Mini 4-H Horse and Pony should contact a leader of the Mustangers to let them know their intentions to either 1) bring their own animal or 2) borrow a regular 4-H member's animal. Youth signed up for Mini 4-H Rabbit, Poultry, Dog, Swine, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, or Sheep need to have a mentor. Their mentor is a regular 4-H member who loans them their animal during the show. Please contact the office if you need a mentor. Review the handbook for all guidelines regarding Mini 4-H animal exhibits.

#### **Static Project Information**

Static projects are also known as non-walking or building projects. There are a few static project changes to note. See below for major changes. However, review the updated handbook for ALL of the guidelines. Changes will be in red font.

- Arts and Crafts: All Lego projects should be entered in "Construction and Architecture Replica."
- Livestock Poster: This is changed to "Animal Education" in the handbook. The project guidelines are similar to previous years, but it is now eligible for the Indiana State Fair. See project rules for more information.
- **Beekeeping:** See project rules for more information.
- **Collections:** There is a collections record sheet that is required to be submitted with the project.
- **Computer:** See project rules for more information.
- Construction and Architecture Replica: The exhibit can be no larger than at standard 8' long table.
- **Consumer Clothing:** See project rules for more information.
- Entomology: Specimens may be displayed in a collection box no larger than 24" x 18" x 3", displayed horizontally.
- **Fashion Revue:** This is now split into two projects "Fashion Revue Consumer Clothing" and "Fashion Revue Sewing." There are also new narrative sheets to complete.
- Geology: Specimens may be displayed in a collection box no larger than 24" x 18" x 3", displayed horizontally.
- **Photography:** See project rules for more information.
- Sewing: There is a new skills card and Sewing Skills and Techniques sheet.
- Shooting Sports: Youth also have the opportunity to participate in muzzleloader and pistol.
- Woodworking: This will now be turned in and judged on FRIDAY of pre-fair week. See the schedule for more information.

#### **Animal Information**

Livestock ID and weigh in will take place at the fairgrounds on Friday, May 9 from 5 pm to 8 pm. 4-H market animals and commercial animals - including market lambs and commercial ewes, dairy goat wethers, dairy feeder steers, dairy beef steers, ALL beef cattle including starter calves, meat goat wethers, market goat does - must attend Weigh-In/ID Day each year.

Animals, including rabbits, horse and pony, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, swine, beef, and dairy, must be entered in 4-H Online by May 15. Failure to do so will result in losing the opportunity to exhibit at both county and Indiana State Fair. If a 4-Her is still unsure of which animal(s) they plan to exhibit at the fair, it is advised they enter all eligible animals on 4-H Online by May 15. Even if the animal is not born and does not have ID data yet, you must still enter the animal with a pending ID. Please see the handbook for specific identification requirements.

There are a few changes regarding animal guidelines. Review the handbook for all of the guidelines. Changes are in red font.

#### **Franklin County 4-H Programs**

4-H is more than just the fair- there are so many learning opportunities that help youth to develop lifelong skills and friendships. I challenge you to step outside of your comfort zone this year and try something new. Included with this letter, you will find several flyers for upcoming events. Registration can be completed in 4-H Online under the events tab.

#### 4-H Camp

In years past, Franklin County has been a part of Area 7 4-H Camp. However, as of January 1, Franklin County has been removed from Area 7 and placed in Area 1. Therefore, we will be camping with Area 1 counties – Franklin, Decatur, Bartholomew, Brown, Jennings, Ripley, Dearborn, Ohio, Switzerland, and Jefferson. Camp will remain at Higher Ground in West Harrison. However, there are a few changes from what we are used to. Camp is for grades 3-12.

Youth in grades 8-12 will serve as Junior Staff. Applications for Junior Staff are now open until February 10<sup>th</sup> on 4-H Online. Please see the application for more information and the dates for Junior Staff trainings. Cost for Junior Staff will be covered by the 4-H Association. For Junior Staff, camp runs from Monday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> until Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup>. For campers in grades 3-7, registration has not been released yet. Stay tuned! The cost will be \$230. For campers grades 3-7, camp runs from Tuesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> until Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup>.

#### **State and National 4-H Programs**

There are so many opportunities for 4-H members to develop skills, create relationships, and discover their passions across the state and even the country. # **Livestock Care Training**

ndiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training is a certification that each Indiana 4-H livestock (rabbit, poultry, dairy, beef, swine, dairy goat, meat goat, sheep) exhibitor must obtain prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair. This certification can be completed at an in-person training provided by the 4-H Youth Development Educator. The training must be completed yearly. One alternative is YQCA training completed online. If a 4-H member chooses the YQCA option, they must provide proof of certification. Trainings in Franklin County take place on

# Weigh In/ID Day

# Animal Identification in 4-H Online

All animals (excluding poultry and dogs) must be identified in 4-H Online by May 15. Refer to the handbook for ID requirements for each species. As stated in the handbook, the office has livestock ID tags available for purchase

# **DNA for ISF Exhibitors**

If you plan to exhibit livestock at the Indiana State Fair, you may need to submit a DNA hair sample. DNA envelopes are available to be picked up at the Extension Office. These MUST be returned to the office by May 15, 2025.

# **Rabbit Tattoo Dav**

Rabbit Tattoo Day will take place on Saturday, June 14 at 10 am. It will be at the Whitcomb Shelter at the fairgrounds. You do not need to sign up in advance.

# Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training



Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training is a certification that each Indiana 4-H livestock (rabbit, poultry, dairy, beef, swine, dairy goat, meat goat, sheep) exhibitor must obtain **prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair**. This certification can be completed at an inperson training provided by the 4-H Youth Development Educator (dates listed below). The training must be completed yearly. One alternative is YQCA training completed online. If a 4-H member chooses the YQCA option, they must provide proof of certification **prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair**.

Youth must sign up for the training they plan to attend in 4-H Online.



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


