Invention Convention is a global K-12 invention education program that activates STEM + Invention + Entrepreneurship (STEMIE) learning to instill problem identification, problem-solving, and creativity skills for life. The Indiana 4-H Invention Convention State Competition is an exciting opportunity for K-12 students in Indiana to showcase their creativity and ingenuity. Student inventors will present their original inventions to a panel of expert judges and engage with fellow young inventors from across the state. Student inventors will win awards and recognition for exceptional projects. The most outstanding inventions will earn the prestigious opportunity to advance to the RTX Invention Convention U.S. Nationals at The Henry Ford in Dearborn, Michigan.

2025 YES Grant Applications EXTENDED to March 15

4-H provides opportunities for youth to take the lead in making their own communities a better place for all. The YES Grant is intended to give youth-led projects the financial boost they need to get off the ground and start making a difference.

In 2024, the Indiana 4-H Foundation awarded 23 YES Grants for a total of \$21,606.30! Read more about these projects on the <u>YES Grant page</u>.

The application deadline for 2025 projects is March 15, 2025, and grants will be selected by April 1, 2025. Final reports are due by December 31, 2025. The application process for 2025 is now open through the <u>YES Grant Portal</u>.

INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE

To exhibit BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, POULTRY, and RABBITS, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA) by July 1, 2025.

1. This certification must be done on an annual basis

2.Pre-registration is preferred **BEFORE** attending a training

3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer

OR a training in another county

OR complete the online YQCA training


To register for the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program, please use https://in.4honline.com. Click "Events" and then click "Register for an Event."
