GIFT WRAP MANUAL

Everyone likes to receive a gift. The way it is wrapped and presented is almost as important as the choice of the gift itself. An attractively wrapped package shows thoughtfulness on the part of the giver. A nice looking gift creates enthusiasm and excitement for any occasion. A poorly wrapped gift usually indicates indifference on the part of the giver. Materials to wrap an attractive gift do not need to be expensive. Using the simplest of papers, neatly, with the appropriate ribbon can do the trick. Attachments to the ribbon and bow are welcome additions to the package and tape should not show

Through this project you will learn how to wrap all types of gifts beautifully and appropriately for every individual and for every occasion. In order to be successful in this, you Must PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE!!! There are a few rules, however, real skill does come with the practice. Each package will become its own work of art and you will be the talk of the occasion.

GIFT WRAP

The Gift Wrap project a member selects is determined by grade level. Members must enroll in the grade level that they are currently enrolled in school. Once a project has been completed or exhibited at the 4-H Fair, the member is NOT eligible to enter that division again or a lower division. A Beginner Champion (Grades 3,4,5) an Intermediate Champion (Grades 6,7,8) and an Advanced Grand Champion (Grades 9,10,11,12) will be selected in Gift Wrap. Packages for exhibit should NOT contain an article. One overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected.

Product Guidelines and Exhibit Requirements:

Grade 3:

Must wrap four (4) packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. You may want to do more. Practice making neat seams, folding the edges of the paper under to create a straight, nicely creased edge.

Grade 4:

Must wrap six packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. You may do more. Learn to make simple, self made bows with loops. Decorate the outside of the box to accent the contents, such as if a shirt, decorate the outside with a tie, etc.

Grade 5:

Wrap six packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. You may do more. Be creative and imaginative by incorporating fancy ideas like flowers, bells, animals, leftover cards, etc. Learn to wrap a suit box or large, deep box. Make and use self made bows only.

Grade 6:

Must wrap eight packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. You may always do more. Remember, skill comes with practice. Wrap large, deep packages with or without commercial wrapping paper and self made bows. Practice lining insides of boxes neatly with tissue paper.

Grade 7:

Must wrap ten (10) packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. May design and use your own paper on at least six (6) of these packages. Suggestions and ideas are found in the section pertaining to paper in this manual. REMEMBER: Make your own bows and trimmings. Some suggestions to use in place of ribbon and bows are yarn, strips of fabric, pine cones, small articles, felt, burlap flowers, fabric flowers, etc. By now you should have gained skill and knowledge enough to create a "work of art".

Exhibit:

Wrap a small, jewelry type box (approximately 3" long x 2" wide x 1" deep or 8" long x 2" wide x 1" deep, approx. within an inch). A self-made bow with loops is to be attached to the package. Exhibit tag should be filled out completely and tied to the top of the package within the ribbon or bow so it can be easily moved when being judged. Judging will be based on neatness, originality, creativity, and appropriateness of materials chosen.

Grade 8:

Must wrap ten packages during the year, not including the exhibit package. May design and use your own paper on at least six of these packages. Suggestions and ideas are found in the section pertaining to paper in this manual. REMEMBER: Make your own bows and trimmings. Some suggestions to use in place of ribbon and bows are yarn, strips of fabric, pine cones, small articles, felt, burlap flowers, fabric flowers, etc. By now you should have gained skill and knowledge enough to create a "work of art".

Some suggestions to use in place of ribbon and bows are yarn, strips of fabric, pine cones, small articles, felt, burlap flowers, fabric flowers, etc. By now you should have gained skill and knowledge enough to create a "work of art".

self-made bow that contains loops. (see Gift Wrap manual for ideas o
