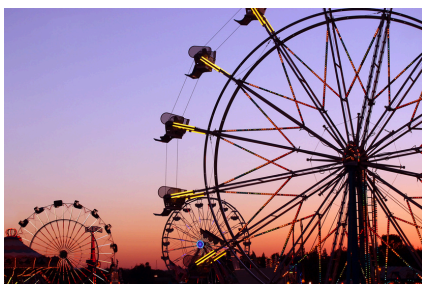
EXCITING SEASON AHEAD

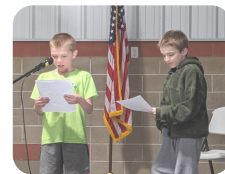

Equestrian Helmet Safety Workshop

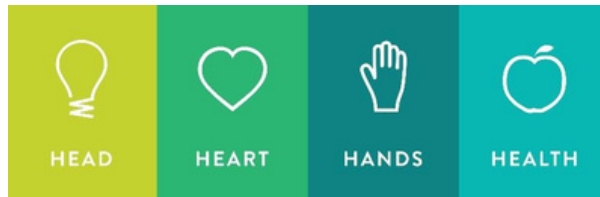
