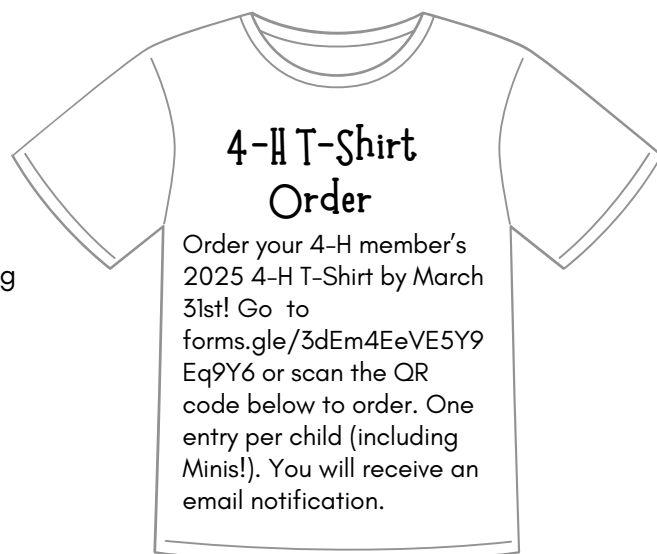

Did you know that participating in 4-H isn't just about exhibiting a project at the fair? While fairs are a fun way to showcase learning, they are just one of many ways for youth to engage in the 4-H program.

4-H members can take part in a variety of experiences, such as:

- Building a robot for a workshop or challenge
- Participating in a Spark Club
- Joining the State 4-H Band or Chorus
- Conducting a science experiment
- Attending an after-school 4-H program



*4-H offers endless opportunities beyond the fair, from hands-on projects to workshops and special programs. Every member's journey is unique*

Each 4-H journey is unique! To be considered complete in their 4-H educational experience for the year, members must:

- Enroll in 4-H
- Have their participation verified by a 4-H volunteer or Extension Educator

Verification can come in different forms, including an exhibit, poster, report, presentation, or a completed record sheet. While exhibiting at the fair is encouraged, it is not required for project completion.

4-H is about learning, growing, and gaining lifelong skills in a way that works best for each member. Whether through hands-on projects, clubs, workshops, or special experiences, there is a place for everyone in 4-H!

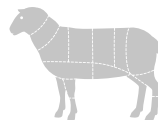


## Carcass Workshop

## 4-H Beef Stocker Class

We are excited to introduce a new Beef Stocker class for the 4-H Beef Show. This division is designed specifically for calves weighing between 700 and 999 pounds, providing a category for 4-H'ers and their calves to compete fairly and successfully. By creating this new division, we aim to enhance the experience for participants and ensure that calves within this weight range are judged appropriately. The Stocker class will be further divided into subclasses based on weight, with 150-pound increments. This structure allows for a more equitable and competitive environment by grouping animals of similar size together. The Superintendent will oversee the subclass assignments to ensure fairness and consistency. In addition to improving competition structure, the

introduction of the Stocker class addresses a key issue from previous shows. Previously, feeder calves that exceeded the weight limit received red ribbons, despite their quality. The new Stocker division eliminates this issue by providing a suitable and fair competitive class for these 4-H projects. To recognize excellence within this new category, we will present Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Stocker Calf awards. We look forward to seeing the positive impact this new class will have on our 4-H Beef Show.

## Showmanship Policy Updates

There's some updates to our 4-H Showmanship policies for the 2025 fair season. Please read the key points below to help your family prepare.

- **All levels of showmanship will be placed 1 through 5.** Only the winner of each showmanship class receives a 1st place award.
- **The Premier Showmanship will be run like a Grand Drive.** For example, if the premier winner is not eligible to participate in master showman, we will bring the 2nd place from their division to compete until the judge selects an eligible showman.



## Stall & Pen Clean-Up

4-H members are responsible for keeping stalls and pens clean during the fair. This is essential for animal care and reflects the dedication and responsibility we expect from participants. This is important for your animal's health, demonstrating responsibility, and creating a positive experience for all fairgoers. **Policy: Stall/pen clean-up is the responsibility of the 4-H member. If the stall/pen is not cleaned, the member will show exhibition only in all species next year, and will not be able to sell at next year's auction.**

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2. Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the Fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers. There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
- Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
- Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
- Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.

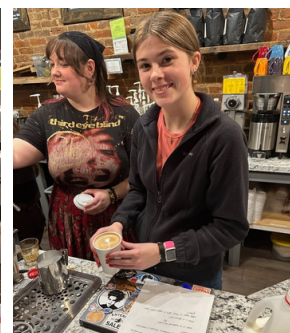

## 4-H Livestock Project to Plate Series

Our 4-H members had an exciting hands-on learning experience at the Project to Plate workshop series with Purdue Extension Educators Anna Denny and Ariel Camm. Participants explored different types of meat cuts, practiced culinary skills, and prepared delicious meals! During the Beef session, members used a beef cut model to learn where different cuts come from and how to identify them.

They connected with Livestock Superintendents Shirley Jones and Kristen Garwood before cooking sirloin steaks and enjoying a meal with baked potatoes and a veggie salad. The Poultry session focused on chicken cuts, and participants worked together to sauté onions, cook a fresh egg, and prepare a flavorful chicken fried rice dish. To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits at the county fair and Indiana State Fair,

4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Livestock Quality Care training or the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program. Quality Assurance training must be completed by 4-H members annually.

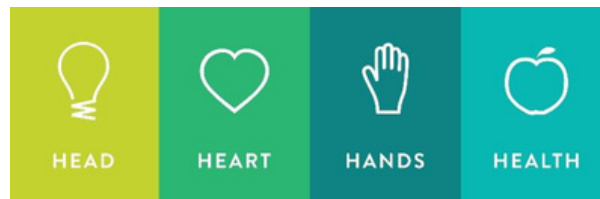
