Welcoming a New 4-H Year in Harrison County



What's a 4-11 Club?

A 4-H Club provides positive youth development opportunities for young people to experience belonging, mastery, independence, and generosity. Clubs meet a minimum of 6 times per year. Below are the different types of clubs 4-H offers:

Community Clubs- Members are typically from the same area, who come together to learn new things, work on projects they're interested in, and help their community.

Project Club- These clubs focus on a specific topic or skill, such as robotics, shooting sports, livestock, etc. They meet regularly to learn more about their projects, work on activities, and master their skills in that area.

SPARK Club- These are special interest groups designated to "spark" an interest in different subjects. They include six hours of instructional time which may occur in one day or over a length of time. Examples of past Spark Clubs we've had include Tae-Kwon-Do, Hiking, Dance, or Music!

Who Can Join 4-11?

Harrison County 4-H is open to **ALL** youth in grades K - 12 who reside in Harrison County. Youth who live in other counties may join if they have interest in a program not offered in their home county upon the approval of the 4-H Educator.

Junior Leaders

Who are the Junior Leaders?

The 4-H Junior Leader program focuses on the development of leadership skills, as well as community involvement and service, life skills, and camaraderie. 4-H members in grades 7-12 are welcome to join. Junior Leaders serve as mentors and role models to younger 4-H



members by sharing their experiences and involvement in 4-H. Junior Leaders sharpen their leadership skills by conducting their own meetings, leading workshops and project nights, and have the opportunity to take lead in organizing events throughout the county.

Mentorship

4-H Enrollment

4-11 Online: Step by Step Enrollment Guide

Creating A New Account:

DO NOT ENROLL UNTIL OCTOBER 1ST!

- 1. Go to v2.4HOnline.com.
- 2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4-H Online.
- 3. Select Indiana from the drop-down menu (select Indiana 4-H Youth Development).
- 4. Choose your county from the drop-down menu.
- 5. Complete your family's information.
- 6. Click the Create Account button.
- 7. Enter your family's address information.
- 8. Click the Verify button.
- 9. If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click the Confirm button and continue to Logging in with an existing 4-H Online account.

If you are **returning** to 4-H, your member record will be listed on the Family Member List. Click "Enroll Now" under 4-H. If you are a new member and your name is not yet listed, click "Add Member" and follow the steps for "Adding a New Family Member," then continue to Step 1 below.

- 1. Select the member's Grade and click Next.
- 2. Select to Confirm that you would like to enroll as a Club Member.
- 3. Click the Select Clubs button.
- 4. Select the County in which your Club is located.
- 5. Click Add next to the Club you would like to join.
- 6. Repeat steps 1-3 to add all of the Clubs in which you would like to participate.
- 7. If you have enrolled in more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click the Change to Primary button to mark a different Club as your Primary Club.
- 8. Click the trash can icon to remove a Club from the list.
- 9. Once all of your Clubs are added, click Next at the bottom of the screen.
- 10. Click Select Projects.
- 11. Select the Club with which you want your project to be associated.
- 12. Click the Add button next to the project you want to add to the member's enrollment.
- 13. Repeat steps 10-12 for each project in which you would like to participate.
- 14. Click the trash can icon to remove any projects.
- 15. Click the Next button once all the member's projects have been added.
- 16. Click "Show Questions"
- 17. Complete the enrollment questions. Some of the questions will be completed for you based on what you entered when you created your record.
- 18. Complete the Health form fields and Consents.
- 19. Click the Next button at the bottom of the screen when you are done.
- 20. Complete the Consents
- 21. Click the Next button at the bottom of the page when you are finished.
- 22. If applicable, review the fees for the member.
- 23. Review the enrollment information.
- 24. Once you have verified that the clubs and projects are listed correctly, click the Submit button.

You will receive an email to let you know your enrollment has been submitted. You will receive another email when your County Extension office has approved your enrollment. You may view the enrollment status on the Member List. Any enrollments that have fees to be paid by credit card will process when the County Extension Office approves the enrollment. Should the transaction be declined, you will receive an email notification. It will include a link to login so that you may add another card or change your payment method.

Mini 4-11

What is Mini 4-11?

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2.

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the Fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers. There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
- Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
- Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
- Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.

Make your own trail mix, cook nobake cookies and bake with biscuits! Learn how to make great treats your family will love.



PHOTOGRAPHY:

Learn the Do's and Don'ts of taking pictures and how to get that perfect shot. Learn about close-ups, landscapes, portraits, and more!



CRAFTS:

Do you like to paint, draw, play with clay and use your hands to create crafty things? This is the project for you!



FORESTRY:

Learn about different trees and what makes them special.



PLANTS & FLOWERS:

Learn about what plants and flowers need to grow both outside and in the house. Help make our planet pretty!



COLLECTIONS:

Learn about collecting. Tell us what you like to collect and why. Bring your collection to the Fair!



GARDENING:

Growing a vegetable garden does not have to be boring. You can plant hot and spicy peppers or cool cucumbers! Grow something you've never eaten before.

What is a 4-11 Volunteer?

There are many ways to be All volunteers must involved in 4-H as a volunteer! We rely heavily on adults who care about the development of youth across the state in order to deliver positive youth development experiences for our youth.

What is Equal Opportunity?

In 4-H, equal opportunity means every youth gets a fair chance to participate, regardless of their background. As a volunteer, your role is to create an inclusive

environment where all kids feel welcome and supported, ensuring everyone has access to the same opportunities to learn and grow in 4-H.

Examples of Providing Equal Opportunity in 4-11

Accessible Activities:

If a youth has a physical disability, ensure that activities are modified so they can participate fully, like offering seated options for workshops or hands-on projects.

Cultural Sensitivity:

Be mindful of different cultural or religious practices when planning club meetings or events, such as avoiding scheduling on major holidays or providing alternative snack options.

Economic Inclusivity:

If a club activity has a cost, consider offering scholarships or fundraising opportunities so that financial barriers don't prevent any 4-H'er from participating.

Diverse Representation:

Encourage and support 4-H'ers from all backgrounds to take on leadership roles within your club, helping them build confidence and ensuring diverse voices are heard.

Inclusive Communication:

Use clear, simple language in all communications and be open to different forms of expression, ensuring that 4-H'ers with varying literacy levels or learning styles can fully understand and participate in discussions and activities



Volunteer Training

ALL 4-H adult volunteers must re-enroll and complete their annual trainings on 4-H Online OR attend an in person training.

In Person 4-H Volunteer Training: October 7th, 6PM **Extension Office Dryden Room**

All volunteers must complete a volunteer application and screening process and participate in training provided by the 4-H Educator, Individuals annually reaffirm their commitment to serving as 4-H Volunteers.

How to Apply

- 1. Submit a completed volunteer application to the Extension Office
- 2. Meet with the 4-H Educator for an interview and to discuss your role, behavioral expectations, and volunteer opportunities



Career Development Events

A Career Development Event (CDE) are competitive events that allow youth to showcase their knowledge on a specific topic. Most CDE's offer individuals and team entries. The following are just a few of the CDE's offered with Indiana 4-H.

Consumer Decision Making

Consumer Decision Making is a 4-H contest where teams of 3-4 judge classes based on scenarios, rank options, and defend their choices through oral reasoning. Open to high school and middle school students, participants can also compete individually if needed.

The state contest features four classes, with participants giving oral reasons for two. Winners qualify for the FCS Classic, a national contest in Denver, CO, held during the National Western Stock Show in January

Hippology

Youth learn and demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of horse management and to learn life-skills such as acquiring knowledge, communicating, solving problems, relating to others and applying leadership skills.

Milk Quality & Products

Youth learn skills necessary for the dairy foods career area, identify cheese, flavors in milk, evaluate ice cream, problem solve, identify milk fat content in products, perform a California Mastitis Test, and will complete a knowledge exam.

Kitchen Skillathon

6th-8th graders to showcase their knowledge of kitchen equipment, small appliances, herbs/spices, and kitchen safety. Teams of 3-4 work individually at four identification stations, complete a written test, and participate in a skills demonstration, with individual scores combined for a team score. In 2024, the event will be an exhibition to introduce the skillathon. provide a stress-free experience, and gather feedback for its official launch in 2025.

Wildlife Habitat

Youth will learn about wildlife ecology, habitat, and management practices while also developing teamwork, communication, decision-making, leadership, and social skills. Activities include a wildlife challenge, wildlife management practices, and a team wildlife management plan exercise
