

Using the QR Code below you will find a Southern Indiana 4-H Camp Counselor and Junior Camp Director Application for 2026, specific job responsibilities for these positions and a bio sheet. We will once again be camping at Country Lake Christian Retreat, located near Henryville. Camp dates for 2026 will be May 29th-31st. There are thirteen counties camping together from Southern Indiana – Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Jackson, Lawrence, Orange, Scott, Washington, Dubois, Martin and Perry.

### "2026 Camp Theme: Under the Sea"

We will be conducting interviews again! Once you submit your counselor application, you will be provided with a link to sign up for your interview time via Jot Form. Again, this year we will be completing all interviews via Zoom to help you prepare for future interviews, which are more likely to be hosted on a web platform in the current hiring process. Interviews are mandatory to be considered for a Camp Counselor or Junior Camp Director position.

Camp Counselors and the Junior Camp Directors will be chosen from the completed applications, as well as interviews. These applications are due back to the Extension office or uploaded via 4HOnline by February 2, 2026. Applications will be reviewed by the entire Southern Indiana planning team. Competition for Junior Director and Counselor will be tough, so please fill out the applications seriously and completely. We will only be accepting a certain number of counselors this year. Counselors will only be selected if they qualify based on the following criteria:

All Counselors: Application Details, Interview, Leadership Potential

**New Counselors:** Educator Recommendations

Returning Counselors: Past Performance, Initiative, Appropriate Behavior

The entire application process will be completed in 4HOnline. If you have questions or need assistance with this, please contact your local Extension Office. Once you submit your application, you will receive an email to sign-up for an interview time.

## Grants & Scholarship Opportunities

### Harrison County 4-II Program awarded STEM Grants!

Harrison County 4-H is celebrating big news! The program has been awarded three incredible grants to take youth programming to the next level. 4-H Educator Anna Denny, who wrote two Indiana 4-H Foundation STEM Grants and one Premier Ag Grant.

The UAV Expansion Grant provides a 12-pack CoDrone EDU Classroom kit along with storage and charging equipment. This will give students hands-on experience with drones, prepare them for the state 4-H drone competition, and allow for thrilling drone demonstrations at the county fair.

The Robotics and 3-D Design Lab is getting a major boost with a new Bambu Lab P1S 3-D printer, a filament starter pack, workstation desk, two SPIKE robotic kits, and replacement laptops. Young makers will now have the tools to explore robotics, 3-D printing, and cutting-edge STEM projects like never before.

Thanks to a Premier Ag Grant, Harrison County 4-H will now have its very own Blender Bike. This exciting addition will be featured at Ag Days and used to teach fun, hands-on lessons about nutrition, fitness, and healthy living.

These grants are more than just equipment. They are opportunities for Harrison County youth to explore, create, and lead in STEM and agriculture. The future is bright for 4-H.

### YES Grant Application Portal Open December 15

The YES Grant from the Indiana 4-H Foundation gives youth the chance to bring meaningful community service ideas to life. Young people can apply for funding up to about \$1,000 to support projects that make their community better. The application window for the 2026 YES Grant opens on December 15, 2025, and closes on March 15, 2026. If you have an idea that helps others, strengthens Harrison County, or solves a problem you care about, this is your chance to turn that idea into real impact!

Harrison County 4-H members were awarded two YES Grants this year, highlighting the leadership, creativity, and compassion of our local youth. One grant supported the Blue River All Stars project called Seasonal Sensations for Seniors, and the second grant funded the Birthday Bundle Project. Both projects show the powerful impact young people can make in Harrison County when they are given the opportunity to lead and serve.

### Indiana 4-11 Scholarships

The Indiana 4-H Foundation helps 4-H youth achieve their dreams by awarding college and post-high school scholarships based on your 4-H achievements. Every year they distribute hundreds of awards statewide through programs like the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarships and the 4-H Senior Year / Foundation Scholarships. Whether you've excelled in animal science, plant and environmental science, leadership, healthy living, communications, or citizenship, 4-H recognizes those efforts.

If you're a 4-H member in grades 10–12 (or just graduated) planning college, trade school, or further training, this scholarship program could help ease the cost and reward all the time, passion, and hard work you've put into 4-H. ### National FFA Organization Scholarship

If you are an FFA member, whether you plan to attend a two-year program, trade school, or a four-year college, FFA's scholarship program can give you a big boost. With just one application, you can be considered for dozens of scholarship opportunities, with the total pool for 2025–26 nearing \$2.5 million. The deadline to apply is January 15, 2026.

This is a great opportunity for students involved in agriculture, animal science, plant science, or related fields. If you have shown leadership, worked hard in FFA or 4-H, and are planning to continue your education, this could help make those plans a reality.

## Agriculture Future of America Scholarships

The AFA Scholarship program gives high-school seniors and current undergraduates who plan to major in agriculture, food, or natural-resources fields a chance to earn funding and a powerful start to their college career. With one application, you become eligible for over 100 different scholarship opportunities — from about \$1,600 to \$3,200. The 2026 application round is open now, with a deadline of March 5, 2026.

Selection is based on more than just grades. AFA is looking for students with real passion, leadership, community involvement, work or volunteer experience in agriculture or service, and a clear commitment to pursuing a food- or ag-related career.

If you're a 4-H or FFA senior who's worked with animals, crops, or community projects, or simply care about food, farming, or the environment, this scholarship could be your ticket to afford college and connect with a network of future leaders in ag.

### Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

### Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

### Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

### Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

**Awards:** A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.
