



Mini 4-H H&P Members Information

- Remember to sign up on 4-H Online all your projects & horses and go to Fair Entry to enter all classes for 4-H Mini Horse Shows. All our leaders and volunteers will be happy to help. 4-H H&P Mini 4-H workshop will be held on the 1st Thursday of the month at 5:30 p.m. We will hold the July workshop on July 1st at 5:30 p.m. at the fairgrounds riding arena.
- All H&P Mini Members and Regular 4-H Members
- REMEMBER TO READ ALL HORSE AND PONY INFORMATION IN THE 2024 HARRISON COUNTY 4-H HANDBOOK Search is
 required to find all information pertaining to Horse and Pony. Also, refer to 2020 H&P 4-H State Handbook available at the
 Extension Office for a minimum charge (\$6.00)

<u>Saddle Log</u>

- Added to H&P Section of the Harrison County 4-H Handbook for clarity.
- "If not showing, complete one chapter in the H&P Manual and a saddle log to be turned in with the General Record Sheet at 4-H Project Check-In." However, if the 4-H member is planning to show but something happens that prevents them from showing then the Saddle Log should be turned in before or during the 4-H Horse and Pony Fair Show with no exceptions.

Measurement ID Card

• Added to H&P Section of the Harrison County 4-H Handbook. New for 2024.

Forms Required on 4-H Online

- Horses & Ponies must have the following forms completed and signed to participate in the Horse & Pony Project.
 - Vaccination Form
 - o (Required For 2024) Measurement ID Card
 - o (Required For 2023 & 2024) Negative Coggins within 12 months of the date of exhibition
 - Combine the Horse and Pony Measurement ID and the Coggins Form into one document then upload it to 4-H Online under either the Horse Vaccination Form PDF or Horse Vaccination Form IMAGE. If you have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, please add it to this document as well.
 - o Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI / Health Certificate) if the horse has traveled from outside the state within 30 days of a 4-H event or if the horse is an out of state horse. An Extended Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (EECVI) is provided by Global Vet Link which is accepted in Indiana. This electronic certificate is valid for up to 6 months and may be used for interstate movements of equine going to multiple destinations, such as shows and trail rides. Learn more: www.globalvetlink.com/eecvi.
 - Horse Vaccination form, Measurement ID Card, COGGINS/EAI form and when necessary, CVI/EECVI Health Certificate must be carried by member to every practice, event, and/or show.

4-H H&P Available Ride Times

A Leader and a Volunteer or two Leaders must be present to ride - Only 4-H Members or 4-H Volunteers or 4-H Leaders may ride. One Leader or one volunteer must be unmounted always - March thru October

4 Steps of Enrollment

YOUTH:



1. Create 4-H Online **Account**

First step is to create a profile on

www.V2.4honline.com

*Returning members will log-in and use 4-H Online to enroll annually.



2. Start attending 4-H Meetings & Join a Club

In 4-H Online, to enroll, you get to choose a 4-H Club. You can now start attending club meetings! You should contact any club leader to find out meeting dates, times, and locations! You can also join more than one club.



Your Project Interest Areas

There are many ways to be involved in 4-H. From attending club meetings, going to project workshops, becoming a Junior Leader and attending Career Development Events, the possibilities are endless. This will help you determine which projects to exhibit at the 4-H Fair. Keep a look out for opportunities to get involved in 4-H!



4. Enter your projects on FairEntry and Exhibit at 4-H Fair

Use the knowledge and skills that you've gained in 4-H to make your culminating projects for the Harrison County 4-H Fair. You will enter your projects into FairEntry online following guidelines in the handbook and project manuals.

1. Fill out an **Application**

New Volunteers Grab your application at the Extension Office. You will submit an application and information for three references. Once paperwork is turned in, we can complete a limited background check.



2. Create 4-H Online **Account**

Once you have completed the application, you will create a profile on

www.V2.4honline.com

*Use 4-H Online to recommit as a volunteer annually.



3. Complete Youth **Training**

Once your 4-H Online profile is created, you will then complete the training videos and guizzes located in the training section. *Must renew trainings annually.



4. Meet with Extension **Educator**

After submitting your application and completing 4-H Online requirements, call the Extension Office (812-738-4236) to schedule an interview with a Purdue educator where you will discuss Adult Behavioral Expectations of volunteers.

What is Mini 4-H?

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2.

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- 1. Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
- 2. Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
- 3. Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- 4. Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
- 5. Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.

There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.

Mini 4-H Projects:

BICYCLE: Learn

bicycle safety, all about road signs and the parts of your bicycle.



CRAFTS: Do you like to paint, draw, play with clay and use your hands to create crafty things? This is the project for you!



COLLECTIONS: Learn about collecting. Tell us what you like to collect and why. Bring your collection to the Fair!




4-H Carcass Project Workshop


