For the Swifties.. Taylor Swift's fall Chai Sugar Cookies



- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 1 large egg
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 cups All Purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 chai teabag (contents only)
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon cardamom
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice (optional) lcing
 - 1 cup powdered sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
 - 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
 7 4 tekstore
 - 3-4 tablespoons milk or cream
 - 1 tablespoon butter melted

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper
- 2. In a large bowl, cream together butter, vegetable oil, granulated sugar, and powdered sugar until smooth.
- 3. Beat in the egg and vanilla extract
- 4. In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt, and spices.
- 5. Gradually add the dry ingredients into the wet mixture, mixing just until combined. Do not overmix.
- 6. Scoop out about 1-2 tablespoons of dough and roll each into a ball. Place them on the prepared baking sheet, leaving space between each one as they will spread.
- 7. Bake in preheated oven for 8-12 minutes or until edges are slightly golden.
- 8. Let the cookies cool for a few minutes before moving to a wire rack to cool.
- 9. Combine all ingredients for icing and spread a thin layer on each cookie.
- 10.Enjoy!

Maximizing the Value of Fallen Leaves

As summer draws to a close, the landscape transforms as leaves begin to fall. Many leaves are discarded or burned, but have you considered transforming this excess foliage into a valuable nutrient resource? One effective approach is to mow over the leaves, allowing them to break down and return essential nutrients to the soil. However, if you find yourself with an abundance of leaves, there are additional options worth exploring. Shredding leaves can create a natural mulch, enriching your gardens, trees, and landscape while providing insulation for cold-sensitive plants during winter months. One of the most beneficial uses for excess leaves is composting. Composting involves the decomposition of organic matter, including leaves and plant material, into nutrient-rich soil amendments that enhance plant growth. Compost improves both nutrient availability and water retention in the soil. To create an effective composting system, consider establishing a compost bin and combining highnitrogen materials, such as grass clippings, with carbon-rich materials like shredded leaves. However, it's crucial to avoid incorporating diseased plant material, as this can hinder the composting process. Utilizing a trial-and-error approach to composting can yield significant benefits for your landscape throughout the year. By rethinking how you handle fallen leaves, you can enhance the health and vitality of your outdoor spaces.





May 2025


<u>Say affirmations</u>
