Invasive Species: Spotted Lanternflies




Spotted Lanternflies are starting to invade parts of Indiana. Populations have been identified in multiple counties within Eastern Indiana. They feed on a wide range of hosts. sucking sap from stems and branches. Spotted lanternflies will also leave behind a residue called honeydew. The honeydew typically results in a mold growing on the host or attracting other pests. Spotted lanternflies can cause economic damage. Their preferred host is the Tree of Heaven. They have also been identified on other hosts such as: grapevines, Maples, Birch, Oak, Pines, Walnut, and Tulip Poplar.


