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Purdue Extension Master Gardeners

Do you enjoy gardening and teaching others about horticulture? Do vou have an interest in learning more about your garden and gaining new skills? Purdue Extension Master Gardeners Program trains gardening enthusiasts as volunteers to assist Purdue Extension with home horticulture education in Indiana communities. This program provides a learning framework for participants to increase their knowledge on a wide variety of horticultural subjects. Purdue Extension Master Gardener Program is all about "Helping Others Grow." In 2023, there were over 2,700 active Purdue Extension Master Gardener Volunteers in Indiana! These volunteers contributed more than 168,000 volunteer hours, which is worth more than \$4.8 million. There were over 300 new interns in 2023. So far, in 2024, over 2,330 volunteers have volunteered 120,100 hours, which is worth more than \$3.6 million. As volunteers continue to log their hours, the number of volunteer hours will continue to grow! Our Henry County volunteers participate in the Henry County Farmers Market, community gardens, and library activities to help educate the community.
