Dear 4-H Sheep Member:

It's that time of year again! The 2025 Howard County 4-H Fair is just a few months away. To exhibit your animal at the fair, please ensure that you meet the following requirements:

• Identify animals in 4-H Online by May 15 at <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u>.

- Siblings may co-enroll sheep, but the animals must be listed separately on each 4-H member's sheep identification in 4-H online.
- Register animals in Fair Entry from May 17 through June 15 at <u>https://fairentry.com/</u>.
- Complete QLC (Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care) training by June 1. Information regarding this training is enclosed.

ALL market lambs must have a 5-digit county tag, and ALL registered ewes will be identified by flock tag or county ear tag. Lambs going to the state fair will need the green Shearwell tag.

Sheep check-in is **Sunday, July 6, from 7:30 – 9:00 PM.** The Howard County 4-H Sheep Show is **on Tuesday, July 8, at 6:00 PM.** Health papers are no longer required to exhibit animals at the Howard County 4-H Fair. However, the superintendent will inspect every animal, and any animal considered unhealthy or contagious WILL NOT be allowed to unload.
