4-H Livestock News...

Animal ID: 4-H members must identify all Beef Cattle, Dairy Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine in 4HOnline by the state deadline May 15, 2025. Animals that are required to be tagged with a 5-digit county tag or attend the county tagging/weigh-in should attend the county event before entering the Animal ID information in 4HOnline.

Animals will be identified online at: v2.4honline.com. This is the same website which youth were enrolled. Each 4-H family is to complete the online identification by May 15 for ALL animals (except Poultry). Members must include the Premise ID for the location where project animals are located/housed when identifying their animals online. For more information and registration forms to secure a Premise ID, contact the Indiana Board of Animal Health at 317-544-2381 or on the web at www.in.gov/ boah/. When enrolling on-line, remember to check the "county born and raised" box for those animals born and raised in Huntington County. Note that the breeder information is not entered on-line. The volunteers assisting with weigh in at the fair in July will need confirmation of the breeder.



Beef...ID Day will be Saturday, April 12, 9 am - 12 pm at the cattle barns, Fairgrounds. All 4-H members planning to exhibit MUST bring their commercial breeding heifers, beef or dairy beef steers to be identified by ear tags and weighed on this date. Animal identification must be completed online by May 15 at v2.4honline.com. All 4-H steers and heifers that are exhibited at the Indiana State Fair must have a DNA hair

sample submitted to the Extension office in provided envelopes by May 15, 2025.



Dairy... An RFID tag for each dairy animal along with registration information and/or identifying tag must be entered by May 15. Animals exhibited a the Indiana State Fair must have a DNA hair sample submitted to the Extension office in provided envelopes by May 15, 2025.



Goat...ID Day for 4-H market goats will be Saturday, May 3rd 7:30 - 10 am, in the ForeFront Ag Solutions Goat Pavilion, Fairgrounds. More information will be US mailed mid-April. A tattoo or microchip animal identification is needed when enrolling. Animal identification must be completed online by May 15. All meat goats must have an RFID tag and DNA hair sample by ID deadline to be eligible for state fair.



Horse & Pony...You will need to go online to complete and submit your ID form and include a color photo of your horse, showing all four feet and the face. If needed, a computer is available in the Extension Office for 4-H Horse & Pony members to identify their animal(s) online. Animal identification must be completed online by May 15th. Don't forget about the vaccination requirements for Horse & Pony animals!





Poultry...HATCH DATE for Broilers is May 19 - 25. This is a correction to the dates listed in the fair book. Poultry does NOT have to enter identification in 4honline but MUST sign up to Exhibit in FairEntry June 1-30.



Rabbit...Rabbits are to be entered in 4honline by May 15. Roaster, Stewer, Fryer and Meat Pens go under the Market Class tab. Breeding rabbits need to know if your rabbit breed is a four or a six class rabbit.



Sheep...ID Day is Saturday, May 3rd from 7:30 - 10 am, Fairgrounds, cattle barn area. Complete details will be US mailed mid-April. Animal identification must be completed online by May 15. All sheep must have RFID tag and DNA hair sample by ID deadline to be eligible for state fair.



Swine...Ear notching will remain the enrollment ID for swine. Additionally, all swine showing at the 2025 Huntington County 4-H Fair must have an 840-RFID tag (Indiana Board of Animal **Health requirement)**. Note that the Huntington Co. Swine Boosters have agreed to furnish a maximum of $\underline{4}$ tags per 4-H member, which will be available by mid-April at the Extension office (additional tags must be located and purchased at the expense of the 4-H member's family). Swine arriving on the fairgrounds at the July 18 check-in will be identified with an 840-RFID tag, if they do not already have one of these tags.

State Fair Swine Exhibitors: DNA hair samples will be required by May 15 for all swine (barrows & gilts) to be eligible for the Indiana State Fair. Collection envelopes are available in the Extension Office along with collection instructions. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to have an adequate sample turned into the office by May 15. 840-RFID tags will once again be required to be in all swine prior to entering the state fairgrounds.

4-H members must have their 840-RFID tags when identifying their swine online at v2.4honline.com. Identification of your animals is to be completed by the 4-H member by May 15th (State Fair Entries only).



INDIANA STATE FAIR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS REMINDER.....It is the 4-H member's responsibility to complete ALL fields in 4honline if the animal is showing at State Fair.



4-H Livestock News Continued...

The Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care (QLC) Program is a replacement for inperson YQCA Classes. All 4-H youth enrolled in a LIVESTOCK PROJECT (Beef, Dairy Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine) must be QLC certified or have a YQCA online completion certificate by June 30th. <u>If you</u> <u>complete the training AFTER JUNE 30th YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO SHOW!</u>

If you choose to complete the YQCA option, you will register for the online course at <u>https://yqcaprogram.org/</u>. The cost of the online YQCA course is \$12. After completing the course, you must email the 4-H Educator with your certification to receive credit. This option is recommended for anyone showing at shows other than county and state fair.

If you prefer to take the QLC in person (instructor-led) course, the cost is \$3 per child, **PAYABLE ONLINE OR AT THE CLASS** at the following times/locations:

INFORMATION: Please pay special attention to ages, dates, costs and other restrictions that may apply. We encourage you to participate in several trips throughout your years in the 4-H program.

You may attend each trip as many times as you would like within the given age/grade ranges, with the exception of Citizenship Washington Focus, National 4-H Congress, and National Dairy Conference. Please note that 4-H trips are funded based on available funds. If funds are limited for a particular trip, we will let you know prior to official registration. Please see each trip for the total cost of the trip and what funding assistance is available. If you are selected for a trip, 4-H Leaders/ Fair Board funds are disbursed, and you fail to attend, you will be responsible for reimbursing the 4-H Leaders/ Fair Board the full amount of your trip(s). <u>Upcoming Events – Extension Ag & Natural Resources</u> Purdue Extension offers virtual inheriting farmland workshop

The Purdue Extension Land Lease Team invites those who have inherited or who might inherit farmland soon to attend the two-session virtual workshop, "Navigating Farmland Inheritance.".

The workshop will be offered on Tuesdays, March 18 and March 25 from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. EST. Adapted from a University of Nebraska Extension program, the series will discuss best strategies for managing farmland.

After you inherit farmland, there are many decisions that need to be made. If you are not already farming, what do you plan to do with this land?

This program will explain and discuss several topic areas: Determining land value and rental rates, Family and landowner/tenant communications Types of farm leases What to include in a lease (legal aspects) Resources for new landowners and / or tenants

Purdue Extension Tools Available for Producers to Improve Profitability

The Purdue Center for Commercial Ag website has tools available for growers including the following (<u>https://ag.purdue.edu/commercialag</u>):

- <u>The Crop Basis Tool</u> examines weekly nearby and deferred basis for corn and soybeans. Daily cash price data from individual grain elevators and processors are averaged within each crop reporting district to create a regional average cash price series. The regional average cash price data is used to compute weekly basis (cash price minus futures price) for corn and soybeans.
- 2025 Crop Cost and Return Guide offers farmers a resource to project financials for the coming cropping year (prepared by Purdue Extension specialists). Gross revenue, cost, and net returns are evaluated on a per acre and per unit basis for different corn, soybean and wheat cropping systems. Breakeven prices to cover variable and total cost are computed for each crop.
