Accomplishment Resume

- Youth participating in the Accomplishment Resume Project will complete documents revisiting their 4-H career and emphasizing life skills acquired.

Ceramics

- Youth in the Ceramics Project will learn how to select a piece of premade pottery or construct a hand-built piece for their own use. Youth will learn about painting, glazing, and staining techniques required to complete the finished product.

Collections

- Youth participating in the Collections Project will learn how to start and maintain collection of similar items that are of interest to the exhibitor.

Corn

- Youth participating in the Corn Project will learn how to select seeds, grow and maintain their crops, and select and harvest the plants and/or grains for exhibit.

Geocaching

- Youth participating in the Geocaching Project will try to locate hidden containers called geocaches using GPS enabled devices and then share their experiences through their exhibit.

Gift Wrapping

- Youth participating in the Gift-Wrapping Project will learn how to wrap various shaped containers using different wrapping techniques and their own creative themes.

Leather Craft

- Youth participating in the Leather Craft Project will develop leather-craftsmanship skills and explore different methods to leather craft while exploring their creativity.

Performing Arts

- Youth participating in the Performing Arts Project will learn how to prepare and perform an act of talent on stage for an audience.

Pocket Pets

- Youth participating in the Pocket Pets Project will learn about smallpets, the cost to raise them, the care involved, showmanship, and much more.
- The Pocket Pets Project may include: gerbils, guinea pigs, hamsters, hedgehogs, birds such as canaries, finches, parakeets, or parrots, ferrets, frogs, turtles, lizards, mice, non-venomous snakes, etc.

Reading

- Youth participating in the Reading Project will expand their literacy skills by choosing books appropriate for their individual reading levels.

Recycling

- Youth participating in the Recycling Project will learn how to makehomes, communities, and our world safer, cleaner, and more efficient. Youth will know what recycling means to our environment and by doing something large orsmall they can make a difference.

Scrapbook

- Youth participating in the Scrapbook Project will preserve their memories in an organized and creative way. Memories may include family, school, 4-H, etc.

Small Grains

- Youth participating in the Small Grains Project will learn how to select seeds, grow and maintain their crops, and select and harvest the plants and/or grains for exhibit.

Soybeans

- Youth participating in the Soybeans Project will learn how to selectseeds, grow and maintain their crops, and select and harvest the plants and/or grains for exhibit.

Sports

- Youth participating in the Sports Project will educate others on a sport they actively participate in by relaying information such as rules, equipment, history of the game, and other related details.

Welding

- The 4-H welding project develops skills in metalworking, equipment safety, and fabrication techniques. Members learn principles of welding processes, proper tool use, metal preparation, and project design while practicing safe and effective welding methods to create functional and artistic metal projects.
