Testing Services Available at the Office for Soils, Forages, Feedstuffs, and Pests


Soils. The extension office has soil testing bags & order forms available at any time. We are happy to help you read results as well.

Forages. We also have a new Hay Probe that can be checked out to collect samples. If you want to test other feedstuffs we have sample bags available as well. Postage is free for forage and feedstuff samples.

Plant Pests and Diseases. A valuable plant or tree dying and you don't know why? We can help you figure it out or mail a sample to the Plant & Pest Diagnostic Lab at Purdue. Samples need to be brought in on Mondays so they don't deteriorate in the mail over the weekend. Fees vary for each service.

Freeze/Frost Probability & Growing Season Length

Figuring out what the weather is doing from one day to the next can be challenging, especially in Indiana. When you are making those decisions for your valuable crops and ornamentals Purdue has several great resources.

5 Steps For Livestock Exhibitors to be Fair Ready!

- 1 Properly Identify your Animal** at the tagging days, see below.
- 2 Enroll your Animal on 4-H Online by May 15**
- 3 Complete required Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training** in person or online YQCA Training
- 4 Fill out a Livestock Record Sheet or Attend 1 Educational Program**
- 5 Enter your Animals in their Show Classes on Fair Entry June 1-June 24**

Beef Tagging is April 5, 2025, 7-10 am on the Fairgrounds

Any youth planning to show a beef steer, heifer, and/or dairy steer at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Dairy Females and previously shown and tagged females with appropriate registration/identification information do not need to come to tagging. Registered Heifers with a Tattoo and an RFID tag do not need to come to tagging. Heifers without a permanent tattoo matching its registration and an RFID tag do need to come to tagging.

Beef Exhibitors should enter gate 1 and drive down to the midway side of the hog barn where they will unload. Trailers will drive all the way around the sheep barn to the get to the front of the hog barn. The road between the beef barn and sheep barn is no longer passable for trailers due to the new covered walkway.

Sheep, Swine and Goat Tagging is April 26, 2025, 7-10 am on the Fairgrounds

Any youth planning to show sheep, goats, or swine at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Previously shown females that have the proper ID do not need to come to tagging. **With construction on the fairgrounds the traffic flow will be a bit different this year so be aware!**

Sheep and Goat Trailers

- Enter the Extension Office gate and drive down the road towards the beef barn. When asked you will pull through the new beef barn and be tagged and weighed there.
- Sheep and goat only trailers can pull through and exit gate 1.


Swine Trailers

- Enter Gate 3 and proceed through the campground as normal.
- When finished, exit gate 1.

Mixed Trailers— Swine and Goats or Sheep

- Enter Gate 3 and tag Swine First. Then go south, around the sheep barn to join the sheep and goat line.

Stop at the Extension Office after your animal has been tagged and staff will enter your animals on 4-H Online the same day! You can also do this yourself at home.

May 15th 4-H Online Animal ID DEADLINE

All 4-H Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, Swine & Horse and Pony Projects must have their animals identified and registered on 4-H Online by May 15th to exhibit in 4-H. There are no exceptions to this Indiana 4-H Rule. Vaccination forms are required to show your Dog, Cat, and Horses. You do not have to enroll your Dogs or Cats.

What does my Livestock Animal Need to be Identified?

Each Livestock project needs at least one permanent form of identification per Indiana Law as set forth by the Indiana Board of Animal Health (BOAH). For most 4-H projects we require two forms on the county level and if the animal will exhibit at the Indiana State Fair DNA Samples are also required.

To enroll your animal 4-H online you will need the following:

- **County Tag and/or RFID Tag**– You will receive these tags at livestock tagging days. Superintendents will distribute these for Cattle on April 5th and Sheep, Goats and Swine on April 26th
 - If your female animal has previously been shown and received these tags they should not return to tagging days. They do however have to be **re-enrolled each year**. The animal is saved on your profile, you will select “Previously Added Animals.”
 - For a complete list of state requirements consult the [Indiana 4-H Animal Identification](#) Document linked here. This information is available in the extension office for paper readers.
- **Birthdate and Weight if Applicable**– Cattle, Sheep and Goats will be weighed at Tag In to be a part of the Rate of Gain Competition. Cattle, Sheep, Goats and Swine will be weighed at fair check in.
- **Premises ID**– Premise IDs are issued by the Board of Animal Health and indicate where an animal originated in case there is a contamination in the food supply. This ID is the same for all animals at one location and does not change. 4-H Families can see this number on previously enrolled animals. New Families need to apply for a Premises ID at this website: www.in.gov/boah/traceability-and-premise-id/indiana-premises-registration/
- **County only Forms**– Born and Bred Contests for Cattle and Sheep and Swine need a separate enrollment form that is due at tagging. The forms are in appendix section of your Handbook. There is a Born and Bred selection on 4-H Online, that is for the Indiana State Fair. Each county superintendent has set more restrictive requirements for county participation so we use a paper form.

If you cannot make it to tagging, you need to make arrangements for a family member or friend to bring your animals, or speak with a superintendent or the extension office long before the tagging date.
