

### Indiana farmland prices continue to rise in 2023

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Indiana farmland prices once again hit record highs in 2023, according to the recent Purdue Farmland Value and Cash Rents Survey. Statewide, the average price of top-quality farmland averaged \$13,739 per acre, up 7.3% from June 2022. Average- and poor-quality farmland increased 5.8% and 0.7% to \$11,210 and \$8,689 per acre, respectively.

"While farmland prices reached a new peak in 2023, the appreciation rate from 2022 to 2023 was much lower than the record-high price growth observed between 2021 and 2022," said Todd H. Kuethe, the Schrader Endowed Chair in Farmland Economics and the survey's author. "Farm incomes and liquidity are playing a role in boosting price growth; however, rising interest rates continue to put downward pressure on purchases financed through mortgages."

Statewide, cash rents increased by a modest amount between 2022 and 2023, yet in nominal terms, all three quality grades are at an all-time high. Per-acre cash rental rates for top-, average- and poor-quality land exceeded the previous highs set in 2013, 2014 and 2021. Indiana per-acre cash rent for top-quality land increased by 1.99% to \$306. Cash rental rates for average- and poor-quality land increased by 2.09% and 2.50% to \$257 and \$212, respectively.

For more in-depth analysis on the survey, the Purdue Center for Commercial Agriculture has released a new Purdue AgCast episode. Listen as Purdue ag economists Todd Kuethe, James Mintert and Michael Langemeier discuss Indiana farmland values, cash rents and results from the 2023 Purdue Farmland Values and Cash Rents Survey. The two-part series is available for free at https://purdue.ag/farmland-values.

The Department of Agricultural Economics conducts the Purdue Farmland Value and Cash Rents Survey each June and publishes it in the Purdue Agricultural Economics Report. The survey is produced through the cooperation of numerous professionals knowledgeable of Indiana's farmland market. These professionals provided an estimate of the market value for bare poor-, average- and top-quality farmland in December 2022 and June 2023 and a forecast value for December 2023.

### 2024 Jefferson County 4-H Fair July 8-13th

4-H enrollment begins October 1, 2023 and has a target completion date of January 15, 2024. The Animal ID Deadline will continue to be May 15, 2024. Tagging dates for livestock will be announced very soon.

Your 4-H Handbook and Extension Newsletters are the official source of all dates and regulations for this program. The 4-H Handbook will contain all relevant dates for the 2024 4-H season and will be published in January or earlier.

### **Jefferson County 4-H Enrollment Fee Change**

As we continue to update and improve our program, we are making a few key changes to enrollment this year. In 2024, there will **no longer be a \$2.50 per project fee**. Instead there will be a \$5 county fee for each child. That means 4-H members can take as many projects as they would like after paying the \$15 Indiana State 4-H Fee and \$5 County 4-H Fee for a total cost of \$20 per 4-H Member in grades 3-12. The \$5 county fee can also be collected on 4-H online at the same time as the Indiana 4-H State Fee. Cash and Check are still accepted in the office for all fees.

If a member only takes 1 project they will be paying \$2.50 more than in 2023. If a member takes more than 2 projects they will be paying less in enrollment fees than last year. We hope that this fee reduction helps our 4-H Families and encourages the entry of additional projects.

Saves family \$20. Entire transaction can be completed on 4-H Online with a credit or debit card or in person with cash or check

### **Jefferson County 4-H Project Record Sheet Requirement Change**

In 2024 record project sheets will **no longer be required for all static projects**. Static projects are projects that are shown in the exhibit hall and do not involve an animal.

Livestock Record sheets will still be required because we believe the tracking of financial expenditures and

medical records is an important skill for 4-H members to learn. Remember that the Livestock Record Sheet Alternative is still an option for youth who demonstrate they "learn by doing." The Livestock Record Sheet Alternative is available in the forms appendix of the handbook. Livestock members can attend a species specific workshop or present to their club to satisfy this requirement. Livestock record sheets are still required to collect premium money. **All Vaccination Records are still required**.

The only paperwork that will be required for static projects will be what is used for judging; i.e., forms that are turned in with the project. See table for that much shorter list.

In tangent with our fee change, 4-H Curriculum books for static projects will continue to be free of charge if requested by a 4-H member enrolled in that project, *while supplies last*. We are phasing out project books for several projects very slowly and replacing them with online versions. New resources already exist on the Indiana 4-H website and will be linked in the 2024 Jefferson County 4-H Handbook under each project title to help bring awareness to this change and provide 4-H members guidance in their project areas.




