What Needs Completed By May 15th?

- All project changes should be made in 4-H Online no later than May 15th. You may add/drop projects from what you originally decided until then.

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care (IQLC)

Registration through 4-H Online is open. Please note May 7th is the last Jennings County

Opportunity for IQLC. May 7th is the rescheduled date for the April 2nd IQLC postponement due to weather. 4-H Livestock Members showing beef, dairy, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and/or swine must attend one of the 3 offered dates or complete the online YQCA Training. Please be sure to register online prior to the event. The cost of the IQLC Training is \$3. IQLC is an annual certification. If you were unable to attend an IQLC Training this year, you must take the web-based YQCA Training at yqcaprogram.org. Please turn in YQCA certificates to the Extension Office once completed.

Animal ID and Tagging

4-H Members enrolled in livestock projects will receive a mailing with more information about Animal ID Day and requirements. If you do not receive the mailing a week before Animal ID Day, please contact the Extension Office. Refer to your livestock schedule for upcoming Animal ID dates.

Premise ID

Registering your premises may be done online, at no charge, and takes only about 5 minutes. Visit the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) website: http://www.in.gov/boah/2642.htm. Please get your Premise ID number before the tagging day! To verify your premises ID, contact BOAH at email animalID@boah.in.gov. All Indiana premises associated with the purchase, sale, and/or exhibition of cattle, swine, sheep, goats, and farmed cervids must be registered by state law.

Soil Sample and Testing:

The Jennings County Extension Office offers soil sample bags and test forms for sample submission. We have a soil probe available to borrow. Office hours are Monday-Friday, 8am-4pm.



Plant and Bug Identification:

If you need a plant, weed, or bug identified, bring it to our office and Emily Peterson, our ANR Educator, will assist you. Please call ahead at 812-352-3033 to make sure Emily is in the office and available. You may also email photos of the specimen to Emily at epeterson@purdue.edu for ID.



Protect Your Flock

From Avian Influenza

- Prevent waterfowl from accessing or mingling with your birds.
- Wear dedicated clothing and shoes to care for your flock. Do not visit other poultry unless absolutely necessary, and wear different clothing/shoes before entering your premises.
- · Wash hands before and after handling birds, feed, or waste.
- Clean and disinfect equipment in contact with birds or waste.
- Check birds daily for signs of illness or death. Signs include: lack of energy, decreased or malformed egg production, swelling of head, purple discoloration on wattles/combs/legs, Stumbling, diarrhea, sudden death.
- Obtain a premise ID number from the Board of Animal Health.



Why Shared Meals are **Good for Adults**




We often think of family dinners as being good for kids. That's true, but they're also good for people of all ages. Here's what the research shows!



DINNER TONIGHT: BUDGET FRIENDLY

One Pan Pesto Chicken with Veggies



Sharing Meals Improves Physical Health.

- · Adults who eat with their kids are less likely to engage in disordered eating behavior like binge eating or skipping
- · Eating with others increases fruit and vegetable intake and overall nutrition
- Adults who eat with others maintain healthier body weights



FUN

One person closes their eyes. The others challenge them to remember details in the room.



- · Eating with others improves adults' moods
- Parents who eat with their kids experience better mental health and fewer depressive symptoms
- Adults who stick with a family dinner routine report higher levels of family functioning than homes without family dinner routines



CONVERSATION

If you could learn anything in the world, what would you want to learn about?

Sharing Meals Improves Social Well-Being.

- Couples who attach more importance to family meals are happier with their relationships
- · Older adults who eat with others experience a decrease in overall loneliness
- · Teams who eat together, such as firefighters, show increased performance after sharing meals

One Pan Pesto Chicken with Veggies

INGREDIENTS

Serves 4

- 1 lb. chicken breasts - boneless and skinless
- 2 med, sweet potatoes - peeled and chopped
- 12 oz. brussel sprouts - ends chopped off, sliced
- 1/4 c. basil pesto
- 2 tsp. garlic powder
- 2 tbsp. olive oil
- salt and pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- Place peeled and chopped sweet potatoes and sliced brussels sprouts on opposite sides of a large baking
- 3. Pour 1 Tbsp olive oil and 1 tsp garlic powder over each set of veggies. Season with salt and pepper if using. Toss to coat evenly.
- 4. Place chicken in the center of your baking sheet, and coat both sides with basil pesto.
- 5. Place sheet in the oven and cook for 30-40 minutes, or until the juice of the thickest chicken breast runs clear.
