Outstanding 4-Her Award

The 4-H Council would like to honor two Outstanding Jennings County 4-Hers who have contributed the most to the 4-H program in the county. These individuals must exhibit leadership qualities. Please complete the application and return it to the Livestock Office at the Fairgrounds by Friday June 13th. There is no grade requirement to apply for this award. Nominations are made by the member or another person. This will be presented at the Awards Banquet on Monday, June 16th. If you would like an application, please contact the Extension office or ask for an application at the Livestock office during fair week.

Bob Amick Award

Each Junior Leader is encouraged to apply for the Bob Amick Award. It can only be received one time. Junior Leaders must have completed two years in the Junior Leaders Club. The award must be applied for and applicants may be interviewed if necessary. The award consists of a plaque and a monetary award in the amount of \$100 and will be presented at the Awards Banquet on Monday, June 16th. Please return your application by Tuesday, June 10 at the Livestock Office at the Fairgrounds. If you would like an application, please contact the Extension office or ask for an application at the Livestock office during fair week.

Award Ceremony

4-Hers please be aware that there will be an awards ceremony before the Livestock Auction on Friday, June 13 at 5:30 PM. The awards include but are not limited to 10 Year 4-H Awards, Farm Bureau Tenure Awards, Scholarships, Livestock Herdsmanship, etc. Please be sure to attend this event so that you can be present to accept an award.

There will be an awards banquet for Static Project Exhibitors and Junior Leaders on Monday, June 16th at 6:00 PM at the Community Building.

State Fair Static Project

If you have a static project selected for the State Fair and would like the Extension Office to transport your project to the State Fair, we will keep the project at the Extension Office until it returns from State Fair. Based on transport space, there may be projects that we request families transport to the State Fair themselves. This eliminates the need for you to return your project to the Extension Office later this summer. Some projects are an exception (Cake Decoration, Foods, Garden, etc). Or if you would like to make improvements to your projects based on the judge's suggestions from the county fair, you may improve and then return to the Extension Office before the State Fair transport. The Extension Office will provide more information regarding when the projects need to be returned to the office for the State Fair at project check-in.

Protect Your Flock

From Avian Influenza

- Prevent waterfowl from accessing or mingling with your birds.
- Wear dedicated clothing and shoes to care for your flock. Do not visit other poultry unless absolutely necessary, and wear different clothing/shoes before entering your premises.
- Wash hands before and after handling birds, feed, or waste.
- Clean and disinfect equipment in contact with birds or waste.
- Check birds daily for signs of illness or death. Signs include: lack of energy, decreased or malformed egg production, swelling of head, purple discoloration on wattles/combs/legs, Stumbling, diarrhea, sudden death.
- Obtain a premise ID number from the Board of Animal Health.

The Family Dinner Project: Managing Mealtime with Fidgety Kids



The Welcoming Table Managing Mealtimes with



Set kids up for mealtime success

- Give them a chance to move, jump, and bounce before dinner
- Try whole-family activities like a dance party, followed by a cool-down with deep breathing exercises

Make their seat fidget-friendly

- Try sensory tools like wiggle cushions or stretchy chair bands
- · Give kids a footstool so their feet don't dangle
- Sometimes it's okay to let kids stand, stretch, and take movement breaks from the table





Meet kids where they are

- · If they need to stim, let them stim
- Set slow goals. If you get 5 minutes of sitting together, that's okay!
- Be realistic about how much sitting and participating in the meal is right for your child

Hi everyone!

I am excited to announce that I am partnering with the **Boys and Girls Club of Jennings County** again this summer! I am teaching CATCH, a Coordinated
Approach to Child Health, in addition to a brand new series of lessons, called
Learn, Grow, Eat, and Go (LGEG, for short)! The CATCH lessons will be taught at
both **North Vernon Elementary School** and **Country Squire Lakes** locations,
while the LGEG series will only be taught at Country Squire Lakes.

The CATCH lessons consist of teaching 3rd grade students about **the importance of all five food groups**: dairy, fruits, proteins, vegetables, and grains, which physical activities are best, and why we should try new foods. These lessons teach kids how physical activity can improve mood and reduce symptoms of stress and mild depression. Each lesson comes packed with food, fun, and exercise!


The Learn, Grow, Eat, and Go lessons are similar to the CATCH lessons but offer a more hands-on approach. Emily Peterson and I will be teaming up to teach the students about **gardening and nutrition**. We will cover topics like what plants need in order to grow, portion sizing, and what people need in order to grow! These lessons will include use of a garden to teach the kids about the full cycle of our food. It all starts with a seed and eventually ends up as a meal on our dinner plate!
