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State Road 3 - Closure Update

Dave O'Mara Contractor, Inc Project Manager, Jon Wick, provided us another State Road 3 update:

State Road 3 will be closed first thing in the morning on Monday, May 6th. We expect the barricades to be in place by 7:00 am or earlier on Monday morning. Please plan your Monday morning commute accordingly. The areas of work will be: Pavement Replacement near the Sand Creek Bridge in Jennings County, Pipe Replacement near 1300 South in Decatur County and Pipe Replacement near 700 West.

Traffic will not be able to cross the Sand Creek Bridge. If you live north of Sand Creek Bridge you use CR 675N or CR 800N to go south.

If you live south of the Sand Creek Bridge, you will be able to come through the staggered barricades at CR 500N. Once the pavement replacement has been completed, the staggered barricades will become a hard closure and you will access you homes as those who live north of the Sand Creek Bridge.

The first pipe to be replaced will be just south of CR1300 South. Once it is completed the crew will move north to the pipe located just north of CR 700W.

Milling will start on Wednesday May 15th just north of the Sand Creek bridge and head north in the north bound lane.

HMA Patching will occur starting on or after May 20th. The patching locations are yet to be determined.

- Seniors: Plain Dealer questionnaire and 4-H Scholarships are due to the extension office by May 15th.

Animal ID and Tagging

4-H Members enrolled in livestock projects should've received a mailing with more information about Animal ID Day and requirements. If you did not receive the mailing before Animal ID Day, please contact the Extension Office. Refer to your livestock schedule for upcoming Animal ID dates.

Premise ID

Registering your premises may be done online, at no charge, and takes only about 5 minutes. Visit the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) website: http://www.in.gov/boah/2642.htm. Please get your Premise ID number before the tagging day! **To verify your premises ID, contact BOAH at email animalID@boah.in.gov.** All Indiana premises associated with the purchase, sale, and/or exhibition of cattle, swine, sheep, goats, and farmed cervids must be registered by state law.

FECAL EGG COUNTS



WHAT IS A FECAL EGG COUNT?

 A quantitative assessment and identification of the number of parasite eggs an animal is shedding at the time of sample collection

WHY SHOULD I GET A FECAL EGG COUNT ON MY LIVESTOCK?

 Fecal Egg Counts assess your livestock's parasite burden and target the parasite your livestock might be suffering from at the time of collection.

SAMPLE COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS

- Use gloves to collect a fresh sample of feces from your livestock. The sample should still be both moist
 and soft. It should be collected and turned into the office no more than 6 hours from the time of
 defecation
- Collect at least 1/2 cup or 4oz. of feces and place in a clean ziplock bag.
- · Label the bag with the species of livestock that the sample came from and the animal's identification.

FAMACHA CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

SMALL RUMINANT PRODUCERS & FOR 4-H MEMBERS AGE 13 AND UP May 15, 2024 at the Jefferson County 4-H Fairgrounds

FAMACHA© is a diagnostic test to help small ruminant producers identify animals that require anthelmintic treatment and those which do not require deworming. The tool is a card that matches lower eyelid color to anemia levels, an indicator of clinical barber pole worm infection.

This training is open to 4-H members and the general public. The event will be followed by a Indiana Quality Livestock Care Training (the required training for Indiana 4-H Livestock Exhibitors) so 4-H Families can get the most out of their evening. Participants must be 13 years of age to receive the certification.

Registration is required to attend and space is limited.



Safe Sitter Program 2024

The goal of the Safe Sitter program is to teach safe babysitting and life skills to children entering grades 6-8. Instructors provide tips to make sitters more confident caregivers. They teach safety and security precautions, such as what to do if a stranger comes to the door, and when and how to call for help. They give information on child development and suggest age-appropriate activities to entertain children and keep them safe. The program gives students hands-on practice in basic life-saving techniques so sitters are prepared to act in a crisis. This course also teaches life and business skills including screening jobs, setting fees, and greeting future employers.

Topics instructed include:

- Safety Skills
 - · indoor safety · outdoor safety
 - online safety
 personal safety
- First Aid Skills
 - · injury prevention · injury management
 - · choking rescue
- Child Care Skills
 - child development child care routines
 - behavior management
