

Mini 4-H will be kicking off their program year on Thursday, February 16, 2023 from 6:30pm to 7:30pm in the Main Hall at the Extension Office. Our Mini 4-H program is for children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade. This program gives these children the opportunity to learn the basics of 4-H in a non-competitive environment by participating in club meetings, activities and exhibits designed especially for them.

At club meetings, Mini 4-H'ers work on fun, hands-on activities related to a particular project, play games, do crafts and learn about selected topics.

Mini 4-H members participating in the animal projects may attend regular 4-H club meetings and workshops related to their particular species, but it is not required.

We encourage parents and guardians to be involved also. By attending meetings, you will learn about how the 4-H Program works and see how you can get involved.

Our goal is to help young children build self-confidence, develop an inquiring mind, set goals & make decisions, relate to other people and develop a concern for the community.

We offer 12 animal projects and 9 general projects that the Mini 4-H'ers can participate in. Each project may be exhibited at the Kosciusko County Fair and the member will receive a Mini 4-H ribbon.

Enrollment Reminders

It is not too late to enroll in 4-H. There is still time to enroll as a Mini 4-H, Regular 4-H or as a Volunteer in Kosciusko County 4-H. To enroll go to: https://v2.4honline.com.

Some things for you to know:

- Use the same login that you used last year. If you have forgotten your email or password, please contact the Extension Office
- Enrollment fee is \$15 per member, with a maximum of \$45 per family. Mini 4-H is \$5 per mini member
- Be sure all of your information is correct, including name, grade, address, email, phone number and years in 4-H
- Project Add/Drop deadline is May 15, 2023. Members must be enrolled with enrollment fees paid by this date to exhibit at the 2023 Fair
- Animal enrollment for all animal projects is May 15, 2023 to meet state deadlines and county requirements. THIS IS HARD DEADLINE. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.

Kosciusko County Scholarship Information

Kosciusko County Scholarship applications for 2023 will be available February 3, 2023 in the Extension Office and on our website: https://www.extension.purdue.edu/kosciusko/ They will need to be submitted to the Extension Office no later than **March 1, 2023**.

<u>ANGLIN-BISHOP AWARD</u>: This award was created in memory of two Jr. Leaders, Mike Bishop and Jeremiah Anglin, who passed away during their 4-H careers. It is meant to recognize a Jr. Leader who exemplifies what it means to be a Jr. Leader, 4-H member and for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our Jr. Leader program.

BOB STIFFLER 4-H BEEF SCHOLARSHIP: The Bob Stiffler 4-H Beef Scholarship was established by the Kosciusko County Cattlemen's Association in honor of Bob's outstanding contribution to the beef industry in the county. The goal of the scholarship is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Beef project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H Beef and Dairy Steer projects by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

<u>TOM SMITH AND RUDY ROSS:</u> Tom Smith was a Kosciusko County farmer and two of his greatest loves were the County Fair and showing sheep. Rudy Ross was a man who was devoted to the sheep industry. Before his death is 1987, he was the oldest Dorset Breeder in the United States.

GENE MILNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Gene Milner was the first pistol instructor in the Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Program. The Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Committee created the scholarship after Gene passed away very unexpectedly. The goal is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Shooting Sports project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H shooting sports project by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

<u>JAY HAAB MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:</u> The Jay Haab Memorial Scholarship is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Swine project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H Swine project by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP: The Kosciusko County 4-H Scholarship program is to reward active 4-H members for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in the 4-H by awarding scholarship to them for a further study at an accredited college, university, trade or technical school.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H POULTRY COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established to recognize those students who have contributed to the success of the Poultry project at the Kosciusko County 4-H fair.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H RABBIT COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship was established to recognize those students who have contributed to the success of the Rabbit project at the Kosciusko County 4-H fair.

IEHA (Indiana Extension Homemakers Association) Scholarship Information

There are 16 scholarship opportunities available through the Kosciusko County Homemakers Association and the Indiana Extension Homemakers Association.

<u>The Kosciusko County Homemakers Association</u>: 2 (two) \$400 scholarships to residents of Kosciusko County. <u>Applications are due March 15, 2023</u>

<u>Career Advancement Scholarship (IEHA)</u>: 8 (eight) \$500 scholarships. One scholarship is given to an IEHA member, one is given to pursue career in the medical field, and six random scholarships. This is a financial need scholarship. <u>Applications</u> <u>are due March 15, 2023.</u>

<u>Steps to Success Scholarship (IEHA)</u>: 5 (five) \$500 scholarships are awarded. Four to applicants admitted to a state accredited college or university and one scholarship to applicants of state accredited vocational and technical program. <u>Applications are due May 1, 2023</u>.

<u>Ruth B Sayre Scholarship</u> is from the Country Women's Council and is offering a \$500 scholarship to foster the educational development of women. Applications must be an Indiana Resident. <u>Applications are due March 1, 2023</u>.



Poss-ABILITIES



Any child of 4-H eligibility age of K—12th grade (Mini 4-H is K-2nd grade and Regular 4-H is 3-12th grade) with different abilities may participate in our Poss-ABILITIES program.

Our purpose to pair a child with different abilities with a 4-H mentor/family to learn about livestock. Animals to choose from are Beef, Swine, Dairy Heifers, Dairy Calf Feeder Steer, Sheep, Goats, Llama/ Alpaca, Rabbit and Poultry.

As part of the Poss-ABILITIES program, members are required to meet with their mentor/family a minimum of 3 times, preferably more, if schedules allow.

In those meetings the member will learn how to feed/ water, groom, and walk/show the animal. The more you meet with the mentor/family and animal, the more the member will learn and feel comfortable with the animal.

Poss-ABILITIES members are responsible to set the meeting times and dates with the mentor/family.

Applications to be in the Poss-ABILITIES program are available at the Extension Office. Enrollment in 4-H is also required along with a \$15 fee for regular 4-H and \$5 for Mini 4-H. Scholarships are available if needed.

YQCA Update

Some of you may remember last year, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) broke away from their partnership with 4-H Online and became their own website entity. Over the course of the fair season, many obstacles and hiccups occurred which led our state 4-H program to uphold increased leniency on your completion of YQCA. After much deliberation, our state 4-H office decided to venture down a new avenue with an animal husbandry program, giving us a YQCA alternative. That program is being called Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care.


