**Who:** Youth grades K-12 interested in learning about livestock with the 4-H program.

**What:** Participants in the program work one-on-one with a mentor family to become familiar with raising and handling an animal and will exhibit at the 2024 Kosciusko County Community Fair in a noncompetitive showcase. Youth in this program can also participate in camps, workshops, and general 4-H projects such as Legos, Crafts, Sewing, Foods, Creative Writing, Sport fishing, and more!

Note: Our target audience is youth with special needs. The purpose of this program is to give youth and their families an opportunity to work with livestock that they may not have otherwise by having them show another 4-H member's project in the special Poss-ABILITIES Showcase. If you and your child would like to purchase your own animal and show in the competitive show, the Poss-ABILITIES program can also provide mentors to help you lease or purchase an animal. Please note your interest in these options on the application and we will contact you with more information.

**Requirements:** Participants must attend a minimum of three visits with the mentor family and the animal they will be showing. 4-H enrollment is \$15 for regular 4-H members (grades 3-12) and \$5 for mini 4-H members (grades K-2). The enrollment fee is sponsored for first year Poss-ABILITIES participants and scholarships are available to cover the cost of enrollment for other members.
