Rule Change Timeline

- ALL Rule Changes are due by Monday, September 30 at 4:30 PM
- Prior to the September 30th deadline, project committees need to meet to go over rule proposals and decide which rule proposals to submit.
- The rules get submitted to the Extension Office and they organize them for 4-H Council to review.
- 4-H Council reviews and votes for approval or disapproval of all rule submissions in the October-December 4-H Council meetings.
- After 4-H Council voting, approved rules get returned back to project committees for communication to project members.
- The rule changes will then be published in the 2024-25 Guidebook.
