Tips for Writing a Great Thank You Card 🕰

- Be specific: Mention what the person did to help you.
- Share the impact: Explain how their support made a difference for you.
- Add a personal touch: Handwrite your note if possible.
- **Keep it timely:** Send your card soon after the event or gift.
- Close with gratitude: End with a warm and sincere thank you.

What is Mini 4-H?

Mini 4-H is a **noncompetitive program** for youth in **grades K–2** designed to introduce children and their families to all the fun and learning that 4-H has to offer. It's a great way for kids to **learn by doing**, explore new interests, and even exhibit simple projects at the fair.

Mini 4-H members can also attend **club meetings** and **workshops**, giving them a chance to meet new friends and be part of the 4-H community from the very beginning.

In Shooting Sports, youth learn how to safely and responsibly use equipment such as rifles, handguns, shotguns, muzzleloaders, and archery. Along the way, they'll also complete the **Indiana Hunter Education course**, building both confidence and knowledge in a supportive setting.

This isn't just for kids—Shooting Sports is a **family-friendly program**, so parents are encouraged to take part too. It's a great way to share an activity together, whether or not hunting is your goal. Many families discover that shooting becomes a hobby they can enjoy for years to come.

→ Beginner Class Reminder:

All first-time participants are required to attend the beginner class (unless they already hold a valid Indiana Hunter Education Card). This class covers the essentials of safety and includes **two meetings per discipline**. *No exceptions will be made to this requirement*.

The next beginner class will be offered in **February 2026**—watch upcoming newsletters for specific dates and details!

Youth with a Hunter Education Card may be able to enter at a higher level after demonstrating basic proficiency during a pre-season test session.

\$ Please note: Each discipline has an additional fee due at the first meeting.

- Audit Paperwork: Be on the lookout for your audit forms, which will be sent via mail and/or email sometime in October
