# **Scholarship Opportunities**

# **Indiana 4-H Foundation Scholoarships**

<u>4-H Club Scholarship</u>: Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

<u>Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship</u>: Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

<u>4-H Accomplishment Scholarships</u>: Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

<u>Categories</u>: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

<u>Awards</u>: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.

Applications are due January 25. Youth may complete their application through their 4-H Online account.

# **Kosciusko County Scholarships**

2026 Kosciusko County Scholarship applications available in the Extension Office and will need to be submitted to the Extension Office no later than **March 15, 2026**.

<u>ANGLIN-BISHOP AWARD</u>: This award was created in memory of two Jr. Leaders, Mike Bishop and Jeremiah Anglin, who passed away during their 4-H careers. It is meant to recognize a Jr. Leader who exemplifies what it means to be a Jr. Leader, 4-H member and for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our Jr. Leader program.

**BOB STIFFLER 4-H BEEF SCHOLARSHIP**: The Bob Stiffler 4-H Beef Scholarship was established by the Kosciusko County Cattlemen's Association in honor of Bob's outstanding contribution to the beef industry in the county. The goal of the scholarship is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H

member in the Beef project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our

4-H Beef and Dairy Steer projects by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY SHEEP COMMITTEE AWARD: \$100.00 to one or more individuals.

**GENE MILNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**: Gene Milner was the first pistol instructor in the Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Program. The Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Committee created the scholarship after Gene passed away very unexpectedly. The goal is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Shooting Sports project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H shooting sports project by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

<u>SHAYLEEN CRITES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u>: A \$250 scholarship is given in memory of Shayleen Crites, a Kosciusko County 4-H member. Applicants must be a 10-year 4-H member or in their last year of 4-H eligibility with a minimum of 3 years of participation in the 4-H Swine Project.

**KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP**: The Kosciusko County 4-H Scholarship program is to reward active 4-H members for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in the 4-H by awarding scholarship to them for a further study at an accredited college, university, trade or technical school.

**KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H POULTRY COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP**: Two (2) \$200.00 scholarships will be given each year by the Kosciusko County 4-H Poultry Committee. This scholarship was established to recognize those students who have contributed to the success of the Poultry project at the county fair. You must also exhibit a willingness to assist other Poultry exhibitors by helping them care for, learn about, and present the Poultry projects in a positive manner. Applicants must be a 10-year 4-H member or in the last year of 4-H eligibility with a minimum of 5 years of participation in the 4-H Poultry project. Payment will be made directly to the school of your choice and credited to your account. This award may be used for tuition, room/board, books, or other school academic fees only.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H RABBIT COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP: Four (4) \$100.00 Scholarship Awards per year. Members must fill out, and turn in the 4-H Kosciusko County Council General Scholarship Application.

# **IEHA Homemakers Scholarships**

There are 17 scholarship opportunities available through the Kosciusko County Homemakers Association and the Indiana Extension Homemakers Association. They are as follows:

<u>The Kosciusko County Homemakers Association</u>: Two (2) \$1000 scholarships will be awarded each

year to college/university students including those seeking a two year associates program. And one (1) \$1000. scholarship will be awarded each year to a Career & Technical Program earning certification/license in their chosen field. Applications are due **March 16, 2026**.

<u>Career Advancement Scholarship (IEHA)</u>: Eight (8) \$500 scholarships. Two (2) scholarships will be given to IEHA members, one (1) is given to pursue career in the medical field, and five (5) random scholarships. This is a financial need scholarship. Applications are due **March 15, 2026.** 

<u>Steps to Success Scholarship (IEHA)</u>: Five (5) \$500 scholarships are awarded. Four (4) to applicants

admitted to or enrolled in a state accredited college or university and one (1) to a state accredited vocational and technical program through a public school. Applications are due **May 1, 2026**.

Ruth B Sayre Scholarship is from the Country Women's Council and is offering a \$500 scholarship to foster the educational development of women. Applications must be an Indiana Resident.

Applications are due March 1, 2026.
