	WHAT ARE THE PROJECT RULES?
1.	Dogs must be owned or leased by March 1st and must be 6 months old by the first training session; no maximum age.
2.	Dog in the project must belong to the exhibitor or member of the immediate family or household. Ownership is waived on 4-H dogs raised for the leader dog program.
3.	Dog may not be exhibited or trained if showing symptoms of any communicable disease or parasites (including ticks and fleas).
4.	Female dogs in season may not participate during the heat period, so they do not distract other dogs or prevent the exhibitors from being able to demonstrate their true abilities.
5.	Current vaccination form is due to the Superintendent by the first training session. The form must be signed by a licensed, accredited veterinarian indicating the dog has been vaccinated for rabies, distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus, leptospirosis and kennel cough. Dogs without a vaccination form will not participate until the form is received.
6.	Wolf-Hybrid dogs cannot be shown in the project.
7.	Dogs must wear a fabric, leather, or chain collar for obedience training and a martingale/slip collar for showmanship training. The leash may be made of fabric or leather and must be six feet in length.
8.	4-H members are responsible for the actions of their dogs.
9.	Excessive and/or inhumane treatment of a dog by the 4-H member and/or family member will be grounds for dismissal from the project.
10.	4-H member should be physically capable of controlling his/her dog (e.g. not a 120-pound dog with a 60-pound 4-H member).
11.	Dog displaying signs of aggression will not be allowed to participate in the interest of safety to others.

12	Commercial advertisement on 4-H members is prohibited during the Dog Show;

13.	Issues/problems not covered by these rules will be acted upon by the 4-H Dog
	Superintendent and Purdue Extension Educators.
14.	4-H members are required to clean up after their dog.

16.	Handicapped 4-H members will be afforded all reasonable access and opportunity to
	participate on a basis equal with any other 4-H dog handler.

	WHAT ARE THE DOG SHOW RULES?
1.	4-H members who plan to participate in the Dog Show must notify the superintendent no later than July 1.
2.	4-H members may show in any or all of the following: Obedience, Showmanship, Rally, Tricks and/or Costume. 4-H members must participate in the dog training classes to participate in the show.
3.	Outside of the show ring, all 4-H dogs must be on a leash or in their crate.
4.	Appropriate attire is required and determined by the temperature on the day and/or location of the show (no blue jeans, t-shirts, or high heels/open toe shoes). No exposed cleavage, bare midriff, or buttocks. No smooth soled boots, high heels, loose fitting shoes, floppy sandals or other unsafe footwear. Girls: shirt/blouse, cropped pants/knee length shorts. Boys: shirt, khaki pants/knee length shorts.
5.	Award ribbons will be awarded at the conclusion of the show. 4-H members not present at this time, may obtain their ribbons from the 4-H Fair office during the fair. Decisions of the judges are final.

#### **DOG SHOW – OBEDIENCE RULES**

4-H member may show one obedience trained dog during the 4-H year. 4-H member must decide which dog and which level they will show and may not change the selection unless the selected dog becomes deceased.

Class A is for 4-H members and dogs that are just beginning the project. Any 4-H member or dog with training before March 1st of this 4-H year must be shown in the first year Class B or above.

Dogs with previous obedience training will be placed in a level of obedience training at the discretion of the trainers.

### **DOG SHOW - RALLY RULES**

Sample stations include: start, halt/sit, left turn, right turn, about "U" turn, 270 degree left turn, call front/finish right/forward, halt/walk around dog, call front/1-2-3 steps backward, serpentine

weave once, halt/down dog, normal pace, moving side step right, spiral right/dog outside, moving down, 360 degree left turn, left about turn, finish.

Penalties include: consistently tight leash, fouling ring, rules violation, disciplining, inappropriate attire

4-H members may choose their own costume theme and will participate as one class.

Judging is based on creativity of dog and 4-H member together with safety and comfort of animal taken into consideration.

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded. No premiums are paid for this award.

Top Dog Award will be presented to the 4-H member with the highest number of total points who has participated in all activities. No premiums are paid for this award.
