The 4-H Council provides a non-formal educational 4-H program for the youth of LaPorte County through the Purdue University Cooperative Extension Service while also facilitating 4-H Youth Development program planning, assist in member recruitment, support volunteer staff development along with providing continued financial support & accountability.

Every year, 5 delegate and 1 trustee positions are needed on the Council. Trustees shall be tenured 4-H adult volunteers that have been with the LaPorte County 4-H program for 20 years or more. A delegate shall be volunteers with active status. Each of those positions serve a three (3) year term and are asked to attend 10 meetings a year, on the second Thursday of every month except July and December.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN THE COMPETITION?

The contest is a four phase competition consisting of the following events:

- Phase 1–Judging Contest, consisting of four classes to six classes. A combination of cows and heifers from the six dairy breeds will be used. Questions will be asked on at least two classes. (August 10-10 a.m. by milking parlor or location TBA)
- Phase 2–Showmanship, points will be assigned for participation. (August 10–11) a.m). If you are not exhibiting dairy at the Indiana State Fair, we will assist you in locating an animal for showmanship. Animals are not required to be fitted.
- Phase 3–Skill-a-thon, 5 station contest (August 10–12 p.m.)
- Phase 4–Test, 40 question dairy management exam. Questions could be on dairy nutrition, health, reproduction, milk marketing and other dairy related information. (August 10-12 p.m.)

Each of the four phases will be weighted equally for scoring.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

The competition is open to Indiana 4-H members in the 8th grade and above (January 1, 2024), who are enrolled in the 4-H dairy project. You do not have to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair to compete in the contest. Pre-registration is not required. However, registrations will only be accepted on August 10 until 10 a.m.

AWARDS- SPONSORED BY AMERICAN DAIRY ASSOCIATION OF INDIANA

Contest results will be announced at the completion of the all the scoring

- · Recognition will be given to the top individuals in each phase as well as the overall winner. Over \$700 in cash prizes to be awarded, sponsored by American Dairy Association of Indiana.
- A \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to the 1st place 4-Her. The scholarship may be won only once-sponsored by American Dairy Association of Indiana.

What are the Objectives of a Skillathon?

- 1. Provide a learning laboratory which will enhance knowledge of the dairy industry.
- 2. Gain self-confidence and skills in one-on-one communication.
- 3. Develop responsibility for completing a project.
- 4. Develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
- 5. Provide additional opportunities to recognize youth for their accomplishments.

The 5 stations for the skillathon may be chosen from the following 20 topics:

- 1. Identifying the parts of the cow
- 2. Identifying breeds of dairy cattle
- 3. Identifying feed ingredients.
- 4. Detecting heat in cattle.
- 5. Treating calves for scours
- 6. Administrating medication to cattle
- 7. Removing extra teats from calves
- 8. Identifying AI equipment
- 9. Care of a newborn calf
- 10. Care of a freshening cow

- 11. Reading pedigree records
- 12. Reading DHIA records
- 13. Parts of the PDCA scorecard
- 14. Parts of the mammary system
- 15. Showing a dairy heifer/cow
- 16. Dehorning a calf
- 17. Causes of mastitis
- 18. Calfhood vaccination
- 19. Body condition scoring
- 20. The dairy industry in Indiana

Divisions (based on January 1, 2024):

Junior - 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th or 7th grade

Anyone enrolled in the 4-H dairy project may compete regardless of whether or not you are exhibiting at the State Fair!!!!!

- Pre-registration is not required. However, registrations will only be accepted on August 10 until the start of the contest.
- Prizes will be awarded to the top 10 placers (\$50, \$25, \$15, \$10, 5-10th place \$5) in each division. Winners will be announced following the completion of the skillathon during the exhibitors meeting. Monetary awards are sponsored by American Dairy Association of Indiana.
