

STATIC PROJECT JUDGING

In an effort to continue to improve the judging experience for static (building) projects. We have made changes to our static project check-in and judging procedure for this year. Please review the information below and reach out with any questions prior to the start of judging. These changes **DO NOT** impact sewing, communications, or foods judging, those will continue as normal.

This year static project judging is broken into 2 phases on the fair schedule |

- Closed project judging (no youth)- During this time judges will organize and review all project submissions using the rubrics provided. We are hopeful that this time will allow judges a quieter atmosphere for their initial project reviews before meeting with youth to discuss.
- Youth Project Review with Judges- Before judges finalize placings, all youth will
 have the opportunity to sit down with the judge to review their projects and
 answer any questions the judge may have about their work. Youth are not
 required to attend this portion of judging, but it is highly encouraged.
- When dropping off projects for judging, you will be asked to indicate if you will be returning for the Youth Project Review time.

Early Project Drop-Off Times: The following times have been allocated for early project drop-off. Projects will be dropped off at the 4-H Exhibit Hall building. If dropping off projects early, you will only need to return at the designated Youth Project Review times if youth are planning to speak with judges.

- Tuesday, June 24th | 8:00am 6:00pm
- Wednesday, June 25th | 8:00am 6:00pm
- Thursday, June 26th | 8:00am 6:00pm
- Friday, June 27th | 8:00am 4:00pm

Judging Day Project Check-In: You will need to ensure that all projects are dropped off no later than the designated check-in time the day that project is being judged. Full judging scheduled is on our website.

- Saturday, June 28th projects | Project check-in 8:00am 10:00am, all projects can be checked in at this time.
- Monday, June 30th projects | Project check-in 8:00am 2:00pm, project check-in for Monday projects only

STATIC PROJECT SILENT AUCTION

Get Ready to Bid! LaPorte County Fair to Host First-Ever 4-H Static Project Silent Auction!

The LaPorte County 4-H Youth Development Staff and Volunteers are thrilled to announce a brand-new, exciting addition to the 2025 Fair: a Silent Auction featuring select 4-H Static Projects! For the first time ever, fairgoers will have the opportunity to bid on and take home some of the incredible work created by our talented 4-H members.

This is your chance to own a unique, handcrafted item while supporting the hard work and dedication of LaPorte County's 4-H youth. Imagine going home with a woodworking masterpiece, a stunning photograph, a holiday decoration, or another amazing project.

Here's How It Works:

- **Project Designation:** 4-H members entering static projects (excluding posters this year) will have the option to designate one project at project check-in that they would like to submit for the Silent Auction.
- **Limited Options:** Due to this being the inaugural year, only one static project can be entered per member. Additionally, only select projects will be allowed to sell in the silent auction. You may only choose to sell in livestock OR static auction, not both, with the exception of eggs.
- **Bidding Begins:** The Silent Auction will take place throughout the LaPorte County Fair. Fair attendees can view the projects and place their bids with bidding ending on the Friday of fair at noon.
- **Support 4-H:** All proceeds from the Silent Auction will go directly to the 4-H members who created the projects, empowering them to continue their growth and development in their chosen areas. We can only accept cash or check to the LaPorte County 4-H Council.
- Suggested Starting Bid: To ensure a successful auction and provide a fair starting point, we recommend a minimum starting bid of \$10 for most projects. However, projects with exceptional material costs or complexity may warrant a higher starting bid, at the discretion of the 4-H member and static project committee.

MINI LIVESTOCK SHOWS



Mini 4-H'ers <u>must borrow</u> an animal owned by another 4-H member (except poultry & rabbits). This year the mini 4-Her will need to find an older 4-H member to work with prior to the day of show. The Extension Office has a list of older 4-Hers that are willing to help or lend an animal so if you need help finding an animal to use please reach out to Kelsey (ksajdera@purdue.edu)! This is really important, please do not wait until last minute to find an animal, we are trying to have more organization during the fair with the mini 4-H shows.

This year 2nd grade only will be able to show swine. This is in the best interest of the hogs at the fair. The hogs get stressed easily and by the end of the day, they are done, like many of us. So for this year, it will only be the first 24, 2nd graders that have a mentor that will be able to show swine. Thank you for your understanding.

Market lambs will show by breed and weight (3 or more to qualify as a breed otherwise AOB).

Market lambs may be ewes or wethers. Breeding ewes will show by breed and age/weight (3 or more to qualify as a breed otherwise AOB). Yearling ewe and ewe lamb breeding classes offered.

RULES:

Open to YOUTH through Grade 12 and/or 21 years of age

- Steers will be weighed from 6:45 to 8:45AM- Saturday, June 14th
- Feeder Steers up to 600lbs and Market Steers 601lbs+
- Steers MUST be DEHORNED, CASTRATED and have an EARTAG
 - Should regrowth occur, the horn must be no longer than 1" in length and must be floating on the skull, not fixed
- Steers MUST have characteristic markings of the recognized dairy breeds (Holstein, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Jersey, Milking Shorthorn or Ayrshire)
- Animals exhibiting any communicable disease in accordance with BOAH will NOT be permitted in the barn, nor eligible to show
 - The Committee reserves the right to evaluate any animal for breed discrepancies or communicable diseases*
- Pre-Third Grade showmen are eligible to show FEEDER STEERS onlyparents/mentors are NOT permitted in the show arena with exhibitor. Any pre-third grade showman exhibiting another exhibitor's animalthere is a \$10 fee to register the showman. If showing their own animal, they fall subject to the \$5 showmanship fee.
- Bring your own bedding (straw or shavings allowed)
- Showing from your trailer is permitted and encouraged
- Animals are ONLY permitted in the Beef/Steer barn or at trailer
- You MUST clean your stall(s) and/or trailer area before departing
 - Manure and bedding MUST be placed in the pit area only- Trash cans are ONLY for regular trash items
- · Show sticks are optional but encouraged
- Hair should be neatly trimmed. No artificial hair/hair fibers, or adhesive permitted.

All proceeds from showmanship entries will be donated towards awards at the 2025 Indiana State Fair

Violation of the show rules may result in being barred from the show for up to 2 years*
