ANIMAL ID DEADLINE - MAY 15TH

The animal ID deadline is quickly approaching. If you already have your animals and they are tagged, you can ID them in 4-H Online now. If your horse, pony, mini equine, pygmy goats, or draft horse was entered last year you will need to REACTIVATE your animal. ALL animals except for poultry, dogs, and cats need to be entered in 4-H Online to be eligible to show at the LaPorte County Fair and Indiana State Fair. They must be showing ACTIVE in 4-H Online.

If you need help putting your animals in the office is happy to help but we will not put them in for you. We are happy to assist, if you cannot make it during regular business hours, reach out to the office as we are occasionally here late or may have a meeting in the evening that we can help before or after.

Again the deadline to ID your animals is <u>MAY 15th!</u> What animals need to be ID'ed or reactivated?

• Beef, Dairy Cattle, Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, Pygmy Goats (ID or reactivated), Rabbits, Sheep, Swine, Horse & Pony (ID or reactivated), Miniature Equine ((ID or reactivated), Draft Horses (if attending State Fair)
