

HISTORY OF INDIANA EXTENSION HOMEMAKERS

During the period of 1910 to 1919, Purdue University gave leadership to organize home economics extension in Indiana. Families were contacted through farmers' institutes. Women's auxiliaries grew out of this movement and from this, the home economics club developed.

Leaders in the counties initiated classes for farm women. In 1910 there were 10 classes. These groups later became known as home economics clubs and finally as home demonstration clubs.

In 1913, the women leaders from various counties in attendance at a conference at Purdue University voted to organize a State Home Economics Association, the purpose of encouraging more co-education groups for homemakers and to promote the teaching of "domestic science" in the local schools.

By 1927, a total of 389 extension clubs with a total of 10,142 members were established. The Indiana Extension Service is the largest organized program of its kind in the nation.

NOTES

DUES, INSURANCE, & MEMBERSHIP

Dues are to be paid by May 15 of the membership year.

Current Members: Dues are as follows: \$17.00 (which includes \$8.25 County, \$5.00 State, \$2.75, for Insurance, \$1.00 District) Program Book is included. If joining after Jan. 1 of fiscal year, you pay only \$9.25 which is County dues & insurance.

Mailbox Members: Per state requirements, the dues are the same as members, \$17.00 this includes a program book. Insurance is paid by you and your tenure remains.

Honorary Members: Pay County dues only (\$8.25 includes a program book); they lose tenure.

HONORARY STATUS

When organized clubs are unable to remain active due to transportation, aging or physical limitations, they may request honorary status. Before requesting such status, the board recommends that such clubs try first to retain active status through seeking new club members or other means. If they cannot continue, they may petition the board and request Honorary Status. This would allow them to attend county meetings and receive all mailings. Final decision would rest with the executive board of the LaPorte County Extension Homemakers Association. Honorary club members are not members of the state association, therefore, they lose tenure status. They have no voting privileges.

MAILBOX MEMBERSHIP

A member who has chosen not to belong to a particular club, but wishes to receive the benefits of the Extension Homemakers Club. The member would be able to attend all meetings and receive the newsletter. Mailbox members do not lose their tenure status and can, if so wanted, work on any committee or event. Individual membership shall have no direct voting privilege.

ARTICLE XII – FINANCES

The Annual Budget shall show the approved amount for the registration fees of the President and Vice President to attend Home and Family Conference. A county officer or designated representative will have the opportunity to have their registration fee paid if either the President or Vice President are unable to attend. The number of attending fees to be covered shall not exceed two (2).

Section 2 Expenditures in excess of budgeted amounts must be approved by the Executive Committee before being paid by the county Treasurer.

Section 3 An Extension Homemakers recognition pin will be purchased for the outgoing President and any member reaching their 50th year of members are the particular to the problem.

ARTICLE XIII – AMENDMENTS AND REVISIONS

Section 1 This Constitution may be amended or revised providing such amendments have been submitted in writing at a Council meeting. Club Presidents will present changes to the local club meetings and voting will be at the following Council meeting. The amendment or revision

will be at the following Council meeting. The amendment or revision may be passed by a two-thirds vote of the voting delegates present.

LAPORTE COUNTY EXTENSION HOMEMAKERS STANDING RULES

- 1. No smoking will be allowed at any Council meetings.
- 2. The use of cell phone on a ring setting is prohibited, please set your cell phones to silent, vibrate or off position.
- 3. In the event that a nominee is not found to replace an outgoing officer, the current officer may remain in that position for one (1) additional term.
- 4. The standing rules of the La Porte County Extension Homemakers will be reviewed annually. They may be amended as necessary or left as previously printed and voted on at the September Council meeting.
- 5. The Clubs making up the Fall dinner or luncheon, International Faire, and Holiday Council meeting will be charged one-half (1/2) of the meal price provided the meal is **NOT CATERED**. If catered, full price shall be paid by all.

Section 7

It shall be the duty of the two At-Large members to attend the Council and pre-Council meetings and to be a voting member of the Council. Term of office shall be one-year.

Section 8

In the event of the death of a County Officer, or should a County Officer be unable to complete the term of office, a replacement will be appointed by the Executive Committee

ARTICLE VIII – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1 The Executive Committee shall be composed of the annually elected Association Officers. The Executive Committee shall conduct necessary business of the Extension Homemakers Council between its meetings and report back to the Council

Section 2 The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the President.

ARTICLE IX – COUNCIL

Section 1 The La Porte County Extension Homemakers Council shall be composed of the County Officers and all members.

ARTICLE X – DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL

Section 1 All members shall be entitled to one vote on the Extension Home-makers Council.

Section 2 A majority of votes cast by members present shall be necessary to elect officers or carry on the business of the Association.

Section 3 The election of officers shall be at the March Council meeting.
The President and Vice President will be elected in the odd numbered years. The Secretary and Treasurer will be elected in even numbered years.

ARTICLE XI – MEETINGS

Section 1 There shall be four regular meetings of the Council yearly to carry on the business of the Association. Additional meetings may be called when necessary.

Section 2 Robert's Rules of Order shall govern this Association in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution.

LAPORTE COUNTY EXTENSION HOMEMAKERS SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship is open to any high school or college student who is a child or grandchild of a LaPorte County Homemakers Extension Club member in good standing. The conditions of the scholarship are:

- 1. The scholarship is to be used for <u>educational</u> expenses.
- 2. Applicant and recipient can reapply for the scholarship each year.
- 3. Applicant does not have to reside in Indiana nor attend a college/university or trade school that is located in Indiana.
- 4. Two (2) \$500.00 scholarships will be offered each year, one per person. MONEY WILL BE AWARDED AFTER ONE SEMESTER is complete and transcripts are reviewed by the scholarship committee.
- 5. Winners will be notified by mail by May 31st.
- 6. Current students will be awarded money at June Council Meeting. New college students will be awarded money at March Council Mtg following completion of transcript reviews.

Applications are available at the Extension Office and are due May 1st.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

Section 1 The Officers of the Council shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Publicity Chairperson, Membership Chairperson, and Past President and two (2) At-Large members. These officers shall serve as the County Executive Committee with the County HHS Educator assigned to the Association as an ex-officio member. All officers will assume their duties July 1.

Section 2 The officers of the Council shall be elected annually by the Extension Homemakers Association Membership from a list of present and past local club presidents and current club members.

ARTICLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Council, the Executive Committee and serve as chairperson of the Leadership Committee, to appoint any necessary or special committees (of which she/he is always an ex-officio member) and to delegate any other duties that may arise. Term of office shall be two years, but not to exceed two consecutive terms.

Section 2 The Vice President shall be in charge of Program Planning, serve as Chairperson of the Education Committee and other duties as designated by the President. The Vice President shall perform the duties of the President in her/his absence. The Vice President shall be responsible for receiving the clubs' VCS reports. Term of office shall be two years, but not to exceed two consecutive terms.

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings (Council and Executive Committee) and read them when called for. She/he shall maintain the roll and verify the vote at Council meetings. In the event of her/his absence, it shall be her/his responsibility to see that the secretary's book reaches the meeting. Term of office shall be two years, but not to exceed two consecutive terms.

The duties of the Treasurer shall be to take charge of all funds of the Association. All funds shall be deposited in a checking account in a bank approved by the Association Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall pay all bills by check. If the death of a County Officer or a past County President should occur, the County Treasurer will contribute \$25.00 from the Council to the Charity of the family's choice in her/his name. A financial report shall be made at each regular meeting of the Council. Books shall be audited by the Auditing Committee annually. Term of office shall be two years, but not to exceed two consecutive terms.

It shall be the duty of the Publicity Chairperson to see that publicity for and an account of all county meetings and activities is submitted for publicity in the newspapers and other media. Term of office shall be one year.

It shall be the duty of the Membership Chairperson to promote membership and provide information about Extension Homemaker's programs and the educational opportunities available. **Membership chairperson serves as the chairperson of Taste of Extension Homemakers event to be held in the fall of every year**. Term of office shall be one year.

Section 4 Honorary Club Membership

A club may be granted Honorary Status by petitioning for approval to the Executive committee and must meet the following requirements:

- (a) 80% of club membership unable to participate in club activities, educational lessons and assigned county committee functions due to age and/or physical condition.
- (b) Members of an Honorary Club may attend any County, Diustrict, and State activity they wish.
- (c) Honorary Clubs shall have voting privileges at Extension Homemaker Council meetings.

Section 5 Mailbox Membership

A Mailbox Member of the La Porte County Extension Homemakers Association is one who chooses not to belong to a particular club, but who wishes to receive the benefits of this Association and meets or receives the following:

- (a) A Mailbox Member pays county, District and State Association dues to the County Treasurer. (Mailbox Members are members of the State and District Associations.)
- (b) A Mailbox Member is entitled to receive the newsletters, attend lessons, workshops, seminars, conferences, luncheons, and other special events.
- (c) A Mailbox Member is encouraged to attend monthly meetings or volunteer for committee work.

ARTICLE V – DUES

- Section 1 Each Extension Homemaker Club shall pay State, District and County Association dues as well as insurance premium annually for each club member.
- Section 2 Dues shall be paid through your local club to the County Treasurer by **May 30**th. If dues are not paid by May 30th you will no longer be recognized as a member of LaPorte County Extension Homemakers.
- Section 3 New clubs organized and/or members joining after January shall pay only county dues for that fiscal year to the County Treasurer. New members will required to pay County, District, and State dues by May 30th for the following year.
- Section 4 County dues shall be determined by the County Extension Homemakers Council. The County Extension Homemakers Council shall have the power to change the amount of dues required to cover operating expenses. Any changes will take effect May 30th of the calendar year.
- Section 5 Individuals belonging to more than one club need only pay insurance State, District and County dues one time.
- Section 6 The fiscal year shall be from July 1 through June 30.

CONSTITUTION OF THE

LAPORTE COUNTY EXTENSION HOMEMAKERS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be called "The LaPorte County Extension Homemakers Association", hereafter referred to as the Association. Affiliated with the Cooperative Extension Service of Purdue University (a non-profit organization).

ARTICLE II – OBJECTIVE

Section 1 Its objectives shall be:

- (a) To promote a knowledge of and to work in programs and activities which encourage the development of Family, Home, and Community.
- (b) To provide and encourage adult education, especially in the area of home economics.
- (c) To coordinate and motivate the membership of the Extension Homemakers Clubs.
- (d) To strengthen and develop families through education in the areas of Leadership, Education and Volunteer Community Support.

ARTICLE III – STRUCTURE

Section 1 The LaPorte County Extension Homemakers Association whose membership consists of all clubs.

Section 2 Michigan City District

- (a) Michigan City District (Area 10) consists of the following counties: Elkhart, Kosciusko, Lake, LaPorte, Marshall, Porter, St. Joseph, and Starke. Michigan City District serves as a liaison between the State Association and County Extension Homemakers Councils.
- Section 3 (a) All Extension Homemakers are members of the State and District Association.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 Any person interested is eligible to be a member in a local club, regardless of race, color, sex, religion, national origin, age or handicap.

Section 2 Club membership shall be any Extension Homemakers Club who has paid State, District and County Association dues for their members to the County Treasurer.

Section 3 Individual membership in a club shall be any individual who has paid State, District and County association dues to their local club treasurer. Individual membership shall have direct voting privileges.

NVON

National Volunteer Outreach Network is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. Members work together to promote communication, education and volunteerism for all people. NVON welcomed North Carolina as a new member state in 2006 to make a total of eight. The states include: Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, South Carolina, West Virginia and Wisconsin.

COINS FOR FRIENDSHIP IEHA INTERNATIONAL FUND



Service projects supported from Coins for Friendship are: Save the Sight/Nutrition, International Peace Gardens, Elsie Zimmer Memorial Fund, Indiana 4-H Foundation, International Center at Purdue and Christian Children's Fund.

A portion of the funds are used for IEHA dues to ACWW (Associated Country Women of the World) and CWC (Country Women's Council). CWC holds an annual meeting where Indiana is represented by our president and ACWW triennials where IEHA may have 5 delegates.

Another project is the Exchange Homemaker program where we bring a visitor from another country to Indiana for a six-week visit to share with our members and then send one of our own to that country and have her visit our districts and share her experiences.

Two of the eleven scholarships given at Home & Family Conference are funded by our Coins.

NICKELS FOR LEADERSHIP

Nickels for Leadership is a voluntary contribution that has previously been sent to National Association of Family and Community Education. It was used for leadership training for members in the

state organizations. Indiana Extension Homemakers Association has benefited from a few of these programs in the past, when state officers have attended training.

Now that IEHA has withdrawn from NAFCE, the money from Nickels for Leadership will be kept in Indiana and used for leadership workshops for our members. District and regional workshops are planned for any interested member of IEHA. Extension Homemakers are very generous with scholarship training and self-enrichment for county officers and members.
