

Marshall County Master Gardener February Meeting Minutes

We were joined by Lindsey Spaulding, the Lead Landscaper at The Botany Shop. Her discussion was about Native Plants. She specializes in converting lawns to native gardens. Some important key points as to why we should plant natives are less space for weeds, insectaries (pollinator strips), as well as they are perennials which saves money. She discussed net-positive landscaping which builds soil with minimal disturbance, mimics natural patterns, and is mindful of resources (water, time/energy). If you were unable to make the meeting, I urge you to look at the PowerPoint she shared that was sent out via email as it contains a lot of great information.

Following the presentation Roy shared some Unity Gardens updates. He was informed that the Extension office could only fund \$1,500 of the \$7,000 proposed grant, with hopes of United Way coming up with at least \$5,000. We will be having another follow-up meeting on March 1st at 11:30 am where we will discuss funding (what's being applied for, and other donors interested) as well as the use of treated lumber in garden beds.

The Argos Friends of the Library project was also discussed. They are looking for something that needs essentially zero upkeep and just want to have a nice seating area for the community to use the free Wi-Fi. Lindsey Spaulding kindly offered to help come up with some natives that would work in that spot.

Aprons were discussed and Barb mentioned that Sheryl Diedrich was going to do the logos, and we will hopefully have them ready before the home show.

Because lunch is provided and seats are limited, participants need to RSVP through the Marshall County Council on Aging at 574-936-9904 a week before each class.



Purdue Extension to Host Fruit Workshop

On March 20th, Purdue Extension will host a Fruit Workshop at the Pinney Purdue Ag Center (11402 S County Line Rd, Wanatah, IN 46390) at 1:00 pm Central. Purdue Extension Educators will give hands on demonstrations for proper pruning techniques for different fruit trees. Additionally, participants will learn about different pests and diseases that can affect fruit harvests and ways to control them.

Fruit trees need proper pruning for improved yields and fruit quality. Thinning out unproductive branches will allow more resources for more productive branches. Thinning can also reduce disease by increasing air flow in the canopy.

There are a variety of diseases and insects that can negatively effect fruit tree health and fruit quality. The first step to controlling problems is identification. Then with the appropriate treatment and timing you can prevent diseases and insects from effecting fruit harvests.
