

# GENERAL RULES

- 1. Each exhibitor may only enter one article per section.
- 2. An entry fee of 50 cents will be charged for each section in each department which an entry is made. Each individual must pay entry fee.
- 3. All entries shall be made as follows: Monday, July 8, 6:00 pm—7:30 pm. at the Martin County Community Building. NO LATE EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- 4. The exhibits will be released on Tuesday, July 16 from 7:00—7:45 p.m. Not responsible for articles left.
- 5. All cakes, breads, 4 cookies, and 4 candies must be exhibited on paper plates or cardboard. Pies should be exhibited in aluminum pie tins.
- 6. If there is only one exhibit in a section and it is not worthy of a first premium, it can be awarded second, third or none.
- 7. A first place award, second place red and third place white may be awarded in each section.
- 8. There will be cash prizes given for ribbon placings: 1st Place (Blue) - \$1.00; 2nd Place (Red) - \$.75; 3rd Place (White) - \$.50.
- 9. An overall sweepstakes award for outstanding exhibit will be awarded in Canning, Baking, Flowers, Fine Arts, Handi-Crafts, Needlework, Quilts, Photography, and Horticulture. In case of a tie, the exhibitor with the most Grand Champions will be awarded Top Exhibitor.
- 10. Any previous exhibit cannot be exhibited again.
- 11. THIS OPEN CLASS IS OPEN TO ANY PERSON ANY AGE AND ANY COUNTY. THE EXHIBIT MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR.

- All work to be done by Exhibitor.
- Please bring your baked items on a paper plate or in a ziplock bag.
- Baked exhibits must be non-perishable. Exhibits using raw eggs or egg whites, cream cheese, whipped cream or other ingredients that require refrigeration SHOULD NOT BE USED.
- 1. Cakes (Exhibit a whole product) No Mixes!
- 2. Cookies (Exhibit 4 cookies)
- 3. Bread (Yeast Recipe Only) (Bread Machine allowed) a. Loaf (Exhibit whole loaf)
  - b. Rolls (4 Rolls)
- 4. Quick loaf (No Yeast)
  - a. Loaf (Exhibit whole loaf)
  - b. Muffins or Biscuits (Exhibit 4)
- 5. Pies (Exhibit a whole pie)
- 6. Candy (Exhibit 4 pieces)
- Snack (i.e.) puppy chow, trail mix, chex mix, etc. (Exhibit 2 cups)
- 8. Create-with –a-mix; Using a mix create your own cake. Use at least three other ingredients in addition to those called for in the mix.(Exhibit the whole product)

- All canned goods must be labeled with the date it was prepared and the name of the food in the jar (i.e., *Green Beans 6/15/24*).

- Entries must be exhibited on foam board in an acrylic frame, or in a plastic page protector. If not in a frame or on foam board, place cardboard behind the photo.

- Judging will be only on the photograph, not the frame or mounting.
