- Jewelry
- Scrapbooking (10 pages marked to be judged)
- Ceramics
- Christmas crafts
- New made from found (used) goods,
- Refurbished bicycles

Class 14—Weaving:

- Basket
- Other woven item

Photography (limit 5 entries/person):

One picture 5x7 or larger, matted or framed, any subject. Glass should not cover picture.

Open Class Guidelines

Entries are open to everyone
(You do not need to be a
Montgomery County resident).

Registration:

Advanced registration is not required, but encouraged. To pre-register, individuals must return registration forms no later than Thursday, July 2nd, with a fee of \$4.00 per exhibit. Registration after July 2nd will be \$5.00 per exhibit. Items may be registered at check-in for \$5.00.

Entry:

- All items will be closed to judging.
- Any exhibits not claimed will be disposed of.
- Care of items will be taken, but the Extension Homemakers and 4-H Inc. is not responsible for items damaged, lost, or broken.
- Each entry will receive a ribbon and be judged on its own merit.
- Exhibits not meeting requirements will receive an exhibitor ribbon but not be considered for a higher placing.
- Comments sheets should be given with each project with judge's comments on them.



Class 1—Specimens:

The following are to be shown in plain containers and judged for perfection of bloom only. Entries with multiple flowers should be all same variety, all same color. Sepals should be removed.

- Aster, 3 flowers
- Rose, 1 flower
- Zinnias, 3 flowers
- Marigolds, 3 flowers
- Gladiolus, single spike
- Dahlia, single spike
- Day Lilies, 1 stalk
- Lilies, 1 stalk
- Cosmos, 3 flowers
- Snapdragons, 1 spike
- Sunflower, 1 flower

Class 2—Flower Arrangements:

- Cut flowers
- Artistic arrangement (accessories permitted)
- Miniature vase & flowers not over 6" tall/wide
- Roadside beauty
- Using wild flowers
- Vegetation, dried flower arrangement

Class 3—Container Gardening:

The following entries should be in suitable containers no larger than 16" x 16". Please include a saucer, if needed. Containers must have been planted at least six (6) weeks prior to the fair.

- Outdoor Container
- House Plant

Class 4—Culinary Arts:

All foods must be displayed using a disposable container. Recipe must accompany the entry.

- Cookies (6)
- Cake
- Pie (No soft pies)
- Muffins (6)
- Yeast loaf or Fancy
- Yeast rolls (6)
- Quick bread loaf
- Other baked item
- Any homemade candy

Class 5—Food Preservation:

All entries must be correctly sealed with a 2 piece lid, labeled and dated. Ring on for exhibit. Recipe must include canning method and accompany entry. Canned products must be canned and no older than 1 year. Must be in a standard brand jar.

- Jelly, jam, preserves, marmalade, and butter (May be opened and tasted)
- Fruits and Vegetables
- Tomatoes/tomato juice

Fine Arts:

Tole painting, water color, oil painting, sketch (charcoal or pencil), acrylic other than tole

Class 6 (Child under 10)

- Scarecrows
