
# To Join Noble County 4-H:

- 1. Sign up at V2.4honline.com
  - o (or call 260-636-2111)
- 2. Pick a Township Club
- 3. Enroll in Projects
- 4. Check out Project Clubs, Events, Camps, Trips, Workshops and more!
- 5. Showcase your work at the County Fair in July and win a chance to compete at the Indiana State Fair in August.

### Costs:

- Regular 4-H Grades 3-12 the program fee is \$20
- Mini 4-H Grades k-2 the program fee is \$5

Assistance maybe available to cover 4-H dues in some townships or through volunteer work. Ask for info in the Extension Office.



# LET'S BREAK IT DOWN A LITTLE:

Who can be a member?: 4-H is for anyone who is in grades 3 through 12 as of January 1 of the previous year. It is open to everyone, regardless of race, religion, color, sex or place of residence. *Mini 4-H is Kindergarten to 2nd grade*.

What is it about?: 4-H'ers have fun with friends at meetings, social activities, tours, camps, workshops and take 4-H project & exhibits to fairs. With over 55 projects currently available in Noble County there is something for everyone.

What is a township club: Your Township clubs connect you with other experienced 4-H'ers who are willing to help you with your projects, inspire you to try new projects, make new friends, serve in the community doing volunteer work. They also raise funds to support club activities and events. Most groups meet in a central place in the township, such as a school, church or community center.

4-H IS LED BY ADULT VOLUNTEERS: Noble County's 4-H program is organized by Adult 4-H Leaders (see list inside). Some specific projects are organized county clubs and meet separately from the township clubs. Parents are encouraged to get involved as well, 4-H is for the whole family to do together.



Noble County 4-H Offers a wide range of Food based project to exhibit at the fair as well as workshops during the year to teach 4-H'ers many culinary skills. There are many projects and skill levels to choose from.

## Baked Foods (State Fair Eligible)

Cookies, Muffins, Granola Bars, Brownies or Blondies Education poster, display or notebook on nutrition topic Layered cakes, quick breads, biscuits, scones, pretzels, and MORE!

## <u>Preserved foods (State Fair Eligible)</u>

Frozen items such as Pizza, unbaked prepped items.
Canned and preserved items such as Jams and Jellies, pickles or salsa

### Cake Decorating (State Fair Eligible) Gingerbread Houses (County Only)

Show off your creative side and build a Gingerbread house or decorate a cake form to display at fair. Be sure to check out our Cake Decorating workshop that takes place in the winter to get you ready for competition at the fair.

## <u>Maple Syrup and Honey (State Fair Eligible)</u>

If you produce your own maple syrup or gather honey from your hives, save a jar for fair and compete against other area producers.

### **Other County Only Foods Projects**

While not elibible for State fair we also offer some county only food projects such as: BBQ, Microwave and Small appliance cooking.



# **Arts and Crafts:**

With nearly unlimited possibilities the Arts and Crafter category is a great place to start for anyone interested in joining 4-H. With most projects being eligible to go on to state fair competitions this is a very fun area and very creative project to try. Outside of general crafts we also have specialized craft areas.

### Construction and Architectural Replica

Do you like building with LEGO or recreating farm scenes, historical events or famous landmarks? This is the perfect project for you! Choose one building medium or combine a few to recreate a replica from a book, story or real life event. You can even come up with a purely original idea, the possibilities are only limited by your imagination. Also check out our LEGO Club, workshops and winter time build events leading up to fair.



<u>Fine Arts</u>: Start with a blank canvas and add Oil, charcoal, pastels, pencil, ink, acrylic, watercolor or similar artistic work to be displayed on canvas, canvas board, or paper. Watch for area 4-H STEM and virtual Painting events to connect you with other artist in our 4-H district.

### Model Craft and Rockets

Cars, trains, and flying things are on the menu for this project area. Snap together, paint, glue and build a to scale model to display at fair.



### Needle Craft

Hand crafted knitting, embroidery, crocheting, needlepoint, crewel, candle wicking, chicken scratching, hand quilting, tatting, huck embroidery, and hemstitching are suggested exhibits. Entries may also include pulled, drawn and counted thread work and punch needle work. Needle craft exhibits do not include latch hook, plastic canvas, machine knitting, machine quilting, or arm knitting/crocheting. *Also check out the Alpaca Fur Needle work and crafts.*

4-H Camp takes place during the first weeks of June every year and thanks to generosity from the Noble County Exhibit Corp, a portion of the Camp dues are covered. Ask the Extension Office for more info!

Campers are grades 5-6 and camp counselors are chosen out of a pool of 4-H High Schoolers, adult volunteers and County Educators. Campers stay overnight in cabin's at Epworth Forest for 4 days and experience a wide variety of activities, educational events and meeting new friends.





# 4-H Round Up & Academy: June

4-H Round-Up and Academy are exciting opportunities offered to our 4-H'ers. Youth who have completed grades 7, 8, and 9 have "Round-up" and Highschoolers have Academy. Attendees have an opportunity to explore a variety of careers by attending classes created just for them at Purdue University. Participants will get a taste of college life and will live in a Purdue Residence Hall for two nights. Recreation events are planned in the evenings and blocks of free time allow attendees the opportunity to build friendships on their own. Contact your local Purdue Extension Office to register. ### Our Mini 4-H'ers are in a league of their own!

Mini 4-H'ers Grades K-2nd have a separate county fair judging event and a few additional projects that are specifically for our Mini's. This is a great way for young children to get involved in 4-H without getting lost in the mix with the older generations.

Mini 4-H interested in taking a livestock project will be partnered with a 4-H mentor and have a separate time to show a mentor's animal during the regular livestock judging event. Their safety is a top priority in the experience as they learn to navigate the 4-H world.

Mid June every year we offer a Mini-Camp to our Mini 4-H'ers grades K-2. This one-day camp held at the Noble County Fairgrounds gives our Mini's a taste of camp life for a day.
