- **All adult volunteers** must re-enroll in 4HOnline and have approved background checks before attending any 4-H meeting, events or working with 4-H'ers. If you need assistance enrolling, please contact the Extension office. Only approved volunteers will be listed in handbooks and publications.
- **2025 tax documents** are due to Noelle by February 9th, 2026.
- **All 4-H Club Banking Monthly Statements** must be mailed to the Extension Office each month. We will have a confidential mailbox for your club treasurers to access but they must come here first. You can have your bank mail them directly if you prefer. Attn: Purdue Extension 4-H 109 N. York St. Albion IN 46701.
- Club Leaders, you must have a **separate president and treasurer** and minimum of 2 unrelated leaders on the committee and financials. Contact Matt Dice for more info.
- Clubs and Townships- Please turn in your **2026 Meeting dates** to the office ASAP so we can share with the public. Email Mcdon197@purdue.edu
- **Fair Board has open seats** for 4-H Townships that need to be filled, if you are interested in joining, please contact Noelle in the Extension office Ngaerte@purdue.edu.

4-H Club Leaders,

Thank you for everything you have done to make 2025 a successful year for 4-H. We had over 3500 projects exhibited at fair, 1820 animals exhibited, with 482 youth exhibiting a project. Your clubs, educational programs, and recruitment are truly helping to raise our kids & community in a positive light.

As we look forward towards the future, we encourage you to reach out to the extension office for anything you may need.

I would like to offer some general 4-H fun events during the fair. **Things like Farmer Ninja Warrior Course and Mini Golf Championships.** If you or someone you know would be interested in helping organize one of these events, please let me know, we can talk.

A few reminders, Make sure volunteer enrollment is done before any interactions with youth. New 4-H year started Oct 1.

People that serve on bank accounts or help in other ways should also have the volunteer training in 4honline completed.

We need to make sure that 2 unrelated & approved volunteers are on bank accounts. People that served in the past and unwilling to do the 4h volunteer paperwork need to be taken off the accounts. I highly suggest 3-4 parents of kids be on all bank accounts. I do request that the statements be sent to the 4-H office, it becomes easier to file taxes if we get copies.

Send us your dates, send us your news, we would like to put them in our newsletters.

4-H Enrollment is open, so get the word out!

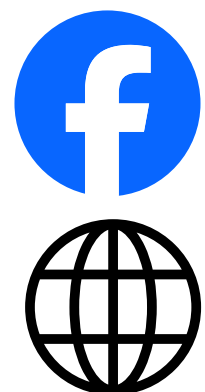
