Putnam County Master Gardener Association Scholarship Application for College Students

Putnam County Master Gardeners are committed to sustainable gardening, soil health, environmental soundness, and community involvement. We support education and outreach to local growers of food, flowers, shrubs, and trees. In offering this scholarship, we hope to further the education of young people who share our values.

This \$1,000 scholarship is available to a Putnam County resident college student, an upcoming sophomore, junior, or senior, who will be enrolled in post-secondary education in the fall of 2025. To qualify, the student must:

- Be enrolled for the fall of 2025 in an accredited two- or four-year college or university;
- o Have a college grade point average of 2.5 or higher;
- o Be majoring in horticulture, agriculture, plant science, botany, forestry, landscape architecture/design, or another gardening-related field;
- o Include a letter of recommendation from a college professor or instructor who has taught this student within the last two years;
- o Include a college transcript listing courses taken and grades received.

This application must be postmarked or emailed on or before April 9, 2025.
