CONCERNING EXHIBITS. IF YOU DO NOT ABIDE BY THE FOLLOWING RULES,

YOUR EXHIBIT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND NO AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. To exhibit at the Putnam County Fair Adult Open Class, you must be a Putnam County Resident, member of a Putnam County Extension Homemaker Club, a non-resident whose majority of work and activities are in Putnam County, or have a student or 4-H'er in Putnam County schools.
- 2. Exhibits must be made or prepared by the Exhibitor and shown in his/her own name. Exhibitors must be 18 years of age or older during the current calendar year.
- 3. Exhibitors may make entries in as many categories as they desire, but only one entry may be made in any one class (except in Photography where entries are limited). Entry will not be accepted for articles in which there is no classification. An article may be entered in one class only. Article will be judged for skills of the particular category. Article should have been made within the past two years and never exhibited at the fair before.
- 4. Judges shall not award prizes to unworthy exhibits whether there is competition or not, nor shall they give awards on articles incorrectly named. Judges may move an item to a different category, if necessary.
- 5. Judging will be based on workmanship, preparation of articles for exhibits, suitability for purpose, beauty and originality of design, as well as harmony of colors and materials.
- 6. Craft items in pairs or sets may be exhibited, but only one may be judged.
- 7. All paintings, drawings, wall hangings, wreaths and framed needlework, etc., must be ready to hang with a wire hanger. Wire hanger is required—no "sawtooth" hangers allowed.
- 8. In Photography category, all photos must be mounted on the designated size mat board, not cardboard or thin posterboard, and **NO FOAM BOARD**. No frames are allowed. A backing board (heavy paper) to cover the back of the photos is to be attached for the protection of and/or loss of photo. The photo with mat and backing board (heavy paper) may not exceed 3/16 inch thick. Only one entry per category is permitted. Entrants may enter up to six (6) pictures in Photo I and six (6) pictures in Photo II, for a total of 12 photo entries maximum per person.
- 9. Care of items will be taken, but the fair will not be responsible for articles damaged, lost or broken.
- 10. Judging of all exhibits will be <u>CLOSED</u> to the public except Quilting in which the judging will be streamed LIVE on the Internet for all to view (still not open judged).
- 11. "Nationally Recognized" holidays are as follows: New Year's, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, President's Day, Valentine's Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- 12. Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be divided up for 2025 as follows:
- ♦ Knit/Crochet/Handspun
- Creative Stitching (to include all exhibits in Hand Techniques and Machine Techniques)
- ♦ Sewing/Wearable Art
- Quilting (judged Live via Internet)
- Artwork
- Paper Crafts
- Holiday Handicrafts
- Handicrafts
- ♦ Photo I & Photo II
- Culinary Arts
- ♦ Food Preservation



JUDGING / AWARDS

Judge may award a first (blue), second (red), and third (white) ribbon for each class.

Judge may also award an Honor ribbon (where he/she sees fit).

Champion and Reserve may be selected for each category.

Grand and Reserve Grand Champions will be selected for each department.

Additional awards are given each year based on contributions from fair sponsors.





Entries received Tuesday, July 15th from 4:00-7:00pm

- 1. Entrants must be 18 years old or older and residents of Putnam County, a member of a Putnam County Extension Club, a non-resident whose majority of work and activities are in Putnam County, or have a student or 4-H'er in Putnam County schools.
- 2. Blocks must be 12 1/2 by 12 1/2 inches. This will allow 1/4 seam allowance for sewing together. This size is required for judging; smaller or larger will not be allowed.
- 3. All blocks must be 100% cotton fabric. You may use any "patriotic" color and design of your choice. The fabrics may be a print or a solid or a mixture.
- 4. Do NOT quilt your block. Do NOT add embellishments to the block (i.e. buttons, lace, etc.)
- 5. Use and design/pattern of your choice. You may piece the block together, applique, embroider or paper piece. Originality, use of color, fabric, design and workmanship will all be considered in judging.
- 6. You may enter only one (1) block with a living Veteran's or a Service Member's name.
- 7. NOTE: entries will have an entry fee of \$5.00. This is to help offset the cost of batting and backing for the quilt, as we will be giving a quilt to a veteran or service member of the winner's choice only one winner guaranteed.
- Blocks will be displayed in the Adult Open Class Exhibit Hall during the County Fair.
- The winning blocks will receive ribbons and prize money. 1st—\$15.00, 2nd—\$10.00, 3rd—\$5.00
- 10. Prizes will be awarded during the Adult Open Class awards presentation on Friday, July 25th at 7:00pm in the York Automotive Community Building—East Side.
- 11. All quilt blocks entered in the contest will become the property of "One Stitch at a Time Quilt Club" and will be used in Quilt of Honor.

We will have a box at the time of entry and all through the fair for extra blocks and/or monetary donations if you would like to donate them to One Stitch at a Time for more quilts to be presented to our Veterans.





- 4. Entries will be accepted Thursday, July 24th between 9:00 and 11:00am. in the Adult Open Class Exhibit Hall in the York Automotive Community Building at the Putnam County Fairgrounds. (note change of day of the week!)
 - CLOSED JUDGING of entries will begin at 12:30pm with two (2) judges.
 - Winners will be announced and awards presented on Thursday evening, July 24th at 6:00pm with Auction beginning at 6:30pm in the Adult Open Class Exhibit Hall.
 - Cash awards will be presented for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place winners in each of the four categories.
 - The Overall Grand Champion, selected from the four first-place winners, will also receive a \$100 award.
 - The Reserve Champion will receive \$50, donated by Jack Dalton in Memory of Flossie Alexander and Dorothy Toney.
 - An award will be given to the best entry among first-time participants by the Darwyn Nelson Family in Memory of Ila Nelson.
 - All entries will be auctioned to the highest bidder.
 - Proceeds will be used for the Adult Open Class Exhibit Hall's operations and improvement projects.
 - Winners will not gain any points toward the Top Open Class Exhibitor Award given in the Adult Open Class Exhibit Hall.
- 5. All entries must be accompanied by the recipe (including crust, fillings, and frostings) on an 8 1/2 x 11" sheet of paper at time of entry. **Entries without complete recipes at cutoff time of 11am will not be considered for prizes.** All entries become the property of the Bakers Best Committee.
- 6. Each entry must contain flavor stated in recipe. The judge should be able to taste the flavor throughout the finished product.
- 7. Persons may enter only one item per category. Categories for entry are: COOKIES 13 cookies; CAKES 1 cake or 7 cupcakes; PIES 1 pie; BREADS (yeast or quick bread) 1 loaf, ring or braid or 7 rolls or muffins. Cream pies or any product requiring refrigeration, including cream cheese frosting will NOT be accepted. Raw eggs and uncooked milk are also unacceptable. Home canned ingredients are also not permitted. All eggs and milk MUST be cooked or baked in the product.
- 8. The container used at check-in is considered a donation and WILL NOT be returned.
- 9. Anyone found not abiding by ALL RULES shall forfeit any awards and will be disqualified.

- 1. All food preservation entries MUST be presented with a complete recipe on an 8 1/2 x 11" piece of paper at time of entry....NO EXCEPTIONS! Standard Ball, Kerr or Mason jars should be used (i.e. no colored jars).
- 2. Canned entries should be clearly labeled. The exhibitors name should be on the bottom of the jar. The name of the product and the date should be on the side of the jar (i.e. Salsa 9/12/21).
- 3. Rings must be left on all food preservation jars. Pickles, Jams and Jellies will be opened and may be tasted.
- 4. It is recommended to use recipes from the Ball Blue Book, National Center for Food Preservation or a trusted source (i.e. Purdue, University of Georgia, USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning, etc.). No untrusted recipes will be accepted. Please site source on recipe.
